- institutions of higher education, representatives from two and fouryear faculty, representatives from private career schools, and representatives from business and labor, shall develop policies for awarding academic credit for learning from work and military experience, military and law enforcement training, career college training, internships and externships, and apprenticeships.
 - (2) The policies shall address, but are not limited to, issues regarding verification, accreditation, transfer of academic credit, licensing and professional recognition, and financial aid. To the greatest extent possible, the policies shall provide for consistent application by all institutions of higher education and a basis for accurate and complete academic counseling.
 - (3) Policies developed by the state board for community and technical colleges along with recommendations shall be submitted to the appropriate committees of the legislature by December 31, 2010.
