**SUBJECT:** Summary of Fiscal Year 24 Drinking Water State Revolving Fund Loan Funding

Cycle

The Department of Health's Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) program accepted construction loan applications October 1 to November 30, 2023. Planning and Engineering loan applications are accepted year-round. The DWSRF program has approximately \$129 million to award and the maximum award per jurisdiction is \$12 million. Standard interest rate for construction projects is 2.25 percent with a 1.0 percent loan service fee and twenty-year loan term. Standard interest rate for lead service line inventories and planning and engineering loans are zero percent interest with a 2.0 percent loan service fee and ten-year loan term.

All DWSRF construction and emerging contaminant loan applicants must have an approved Water System Plan (WSP), a Small Water System Management Program (SWSMP), or plan amendment containing the proposed DWSRF project to be eligible for funding (WAC 246-296-100).

The DWSRF program is currently awarding subsidy under an <u>emergency rule</u> that updates the definition of "disadvantaged communities" and allows up to 100 percent loan principal forgiveness. The emergency rule and accompanying guidance found in the <u>DWSRF</u> <u>Construction Loan Guidance</u> ensure that Washington can leverage the total amount of federal funding. Rulemaking to adopt a final rule and is currently ongoing and expected to be completed in August 2024.

Fourteen qualifying disadvantaged community construction loan applicants will receive loans at a minimum 39 percent subsidy. Final subsidy amounts are dependent on the federal budget and

allotment of the DWSRF base grant. Subsidy for the emerging contaminant funding is 100 percent to all eight applicants. For the lead service line inventory, three applicants were identified as disadvantaged communities qualifying them for approximately 70 percent subsidy.

DWSRF received 38 construction loan applications with a total funding request of just over \$107.5 million. DWSRF received an additional \$60 million in applications for projects addressing emerging contaminants and almost \$1.3 million in applications for assistance in completing federally required lead service line inventories. We reviewed all projects for eligibility, scored based on the health risk addressed by the proposed project, and assessed for financial viability by our underwriter. Projects totaling over \$15 million were withdrawn or determined to be ineligible for funding due to a variety of reasons, including failure to have an approved WSP, receivership, or the project submitted was primarily to support system growth.

We also received almost \$3 million in Planning and Engineering project applications for the completion of engineering needs leading to construction of vital water delivery projects.

Following is the list of projects we will fund, as well as those that were withdrawn or deemed ineligible for funding, based on the information available to date. All loans are pending underwriting and contract acceptance by the applicant.
