1 AN ACT Relating to contractor registration requirements; and
2 amending RCW 18.27.030.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 18.27.030 and 1988 c 285 s 1 are each amended to read
5 as follows:

6 An applicant for registration as a contractor shall submit an
7 application under oath upon a form to be prescribed by the director and
8 which shall include the following information pertaining to the
9 applicant:

- 10 (1) Employer social security number.
- 11 (2) Industrial insurance number.
- 12 (3) Employment security department number.
- 13 (4) State excise tax registration number.

1 (5) Unified business identifier (UBI) account number may be
2 substituted for the information required by subsections (2), (3), and
3 (4) of this section.

4 (6) Type of contracting activity, whether a general or a specialty
5 contractor and if the latter, the type of specialty.

6 (7) The name and address of each partner if the applicant be a firm
7 or partnership, or the name and address of the owner if the applicant
8 be an individual proprietorship, or the name and address of the
9 corporate officers and statutory agent, if any, if the applicant be a
10 corporation. The information contained in such application shall be a
11 matter of public record and open to public inspection.

12 Registration shall be denied if the applicant has been previously
13 registered as a sole proprietor, partnership or corporation, and was a
14 principal or officer of the corporation, and if the applicant has an
15 unsatisfied final judgment in an action based on RCW 18.27.040 that
16 incurred during a previous registration under this chapter.

17 The department may, by rule, require that persons registering as
18 contractors under this chapter for the first time or after a lapse of
19 two years or more attend an informational seminar on laws and practices
20 applicable to the business of contracting in the state of Washington.
21 Failure to attend such a seminar within six months of the date of
22 registration is grounds for revocation of the person's registration.
