1       AN ACT Relating to environmental interpretation in Washington's  
2 state parks; and adding new sections to chapter 43.51 RCW.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4       NEW SECTION.   **Sec. 1.**   INTENT.   The legislature finds that the  
5 lands owned and managed by the state parks and recreation commission  
6 are a significant collection of valuable natural, historical, and  
7 cultural resources for the citizens of Washington state.   The  
8 legislature further finds that if citizens understand and appreciate  
9 the state park ecological resources, they will come to appreciate and  
10 understand the ecosystems and natural resources throughout the state.  
11 Therefore, the state parks and recreation commission may increase the  
12 use of its facilities and resources to provide environmental  
13 interpretation throughout the state parks system.

1        NEW SECTION.   **Sec. 2.**   DEFINITIONS.   The state parks and recreation  
2   commission may provide environmental interpretative activities for  
3   visitors to state parks that:

4        (1)   Explain the functions, history, and cultural aspects of  
5   ecosystems;

6        (2)   Explain the relationship between human needs, human behaviors  
7   and attitudes, and the environment; and

8        (3)   Offer experiences and information to increase citizen  
9   appreciation and stewardship of the environment and its multiple uses.

10       NEW SECTION.   **Sec. 3.**   The state parks and recreation commission  
11   may consult and enter into agreements with and solicit assistance from  
12   private sector organizations and other governmental agencies that are  
13   interested in conserving and interpreting Washington's environment.  
14   The commission shall not permit commercial advertising in state park  
15   lands or interpretive centers as a condition of such agreements. Logos  
16   or credit lines for sponsoring organizations may be permitted. The  
17   commission shall maintain an accounting of all monetary gifts provided,  
18   and expenditures of monetary gifts shall not be used to increase  
19   personnel.

20       NEW SECTION.   **Sec. 4.**   Sections 1 through 3 of this act are each  
21   added to chapter 43.51 RCW.
