8 "NEW SECTION. **Sec. 3.** A new section is added to chapter 2.68 RCW
9 to read as follows:

10 The supreme court, the court of appeals and all superior and
11 district courts, through the judicial information system committee,
12 shall:

13 (1) Continue to plan for and implement processes for making
14 judicial information available electronically;

15 (2) Promote and facilitate electronic access to the public of
16 judicial information and services;

17 (3) Establish technical standards for such services;

18 (4) Consider electronic public access needs when planning new
19 information systems or major upgrades of information systems;

20 (5) Develop processes to determine which judicial information the
21 public most wants and needs;

22 (6) Increase capabilities to receive information electronically
23 from the public and transmit forms, applications and other
24 communications and transactions electronically;

25 (7) Use technologies that allow continuous access twenty-four hours
26 a day, seven days per week, involve little or no cost to access, and
27 are capable of being used by persons without extensive technology
28 ability; and

29 (8) Consider and incorporate wherever possible ease of access to
30 electronic technologies by persons with disabilities.

31 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 4.** A new section is added to chapter 44.68 RCW
32 to read as follows:

1 The legislature and legislative agencies through the joint
2 legislative systems committee, shall:

3 (1) Continue to plan for and implement processes for making
4 legislative information available electronically;

5 (2) Promote and facilitate electronic access to the public of
6 legislative information and services;

7 (3) Establish technical standards for such services;

8 (4) Consider electronic public access needs when planning new
9 information systems or major upgrades of information systems;

10 (5) Develop processes to determine which legislative information
11 the public most wants and needs;

12 (6) Increase capabilities to receive information electronically
13 from the public and transmit forms, applications and other
14 communications and transactions electronically;

15 (7) Use technologies that allow continuous access twenty-four hours
16 a day, seven days per week, involve little or no cost to access, and
17 are capable of being used by persons without extensive technology
18 ability; and

19 (8) Consider and incorporate wherever possible ease of access to
20 electronic technologies by persons with disabilities."
