assistance for five years.

HB 1880-S - DIGEST

(AS OF HOUSE 2ND READING 3/14/95)

Declares that recipients of public assistance who provide
false or misleading information to qualify for assistance will be
ineligible six months for a first offense, twelve months for a
second offense, and permanently ineligible for a third offense.
