1            WHEREAS, Issues raised during past legislative sessions have shown  
2 that there is a need to provide properly for those who are currently  
3 giving service or have given service to their state and country; and

4            WHEREAS, Especially due to federal cuts in programs, veterans,  
5 members of the active duty military forces, and members of the national  
6 guard and reserve components in Washington state must have  
7 consideration given to their unique concerns and the programs designed  
8 for their assistance;

9            NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, By the House of Representatives of  
10 the state of Washington, the Senate concurring, That a Joint Select  
11 Committee on Veterans and Military Affairs be created; and

12            BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the committee consist of sixteen  
13 members, four members from each major caucus of the Senate, appointed  
14 by the President of the Senate, and four members from each major caucus  
15 of the House of Representatives, appointed by the Co-Speakers of the  
16 House of Representatives; and

17            BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the committee shall be co-chaired by  
18 a member of the committee from the House of Representatives, selected  
19 by the members of the committee from the House of Representatives, and  
20 a member of the committee from the Senate, selected by the members of  
21 the committee from the Senate; and

1       BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the committee examine and define  
2 issues and make recommendations to the governor, the legislature, and  
3 state agencies with respect to desirable changes in programs, laws, and  
4 administrative practices affecting veterans and military affairs before  
5 each legislative session.

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
