Strike everything after the enacting clause and insert the following:

3 "Sec. 1. RCW 67.28.180 and 2007 c 189 s 1 are each amended to read 4 as follows:

5 (1) Subject to the conditions set forth in subsections (2) and (3) 6 of this section, the legislative body of any county or any city, is 7 authorized to levy and collect a special excise tax of not to exceed 8 two percent on the sale of or charge made for the furnishing of lodging 9 that is subject to tax under chapter 82.08 RCW.

10 (2) Any levy authorized by this section ((shall be)) is subject to 11 the following:

(a) Any county ordinance or resolution adopted pursuant to this section ((shall)) <u>must</u> contain, in addition to all other provisions required to conform to this chapter, a provision allowing a credit against the county tax for the full amount of any city tax imposed pursuant to this section upon the same taxable event.

(b)(i) In the event that any county has levied the tax authorized 17 18 by this section and has, prior to June 26, 1975, either pledged the tax revenues for payment of principal and interest on city revenue or 19 general obligation bonds authorized and issued pursuant to RCW 20 21 67.28.150 through 67.28.160 or has authorized and issued revenue or 22 general obligation bonds pursuant to the provisions of RCW 67.28.150 23 through 67.28.160, such county ((shall-be)) is exempt from the provisions of (a) of this subsection, to the extent that the tax 24 25 revenues are pledged for payment of principal and interest on bonds issued at any time pursuant to the provisions of RCW 67.28.150 through 26 27 67.28.160((+ PROVIDED, - That)). However, so much of ((such)) the pledged tax revenues, together with any investment earnings thereon, 28 29 not immediately necessary for actual payment of principal and interest on such bonds may be used: $((\frac{1}{2}))$ (A) In any county with a population 30

of one million five hundred thousand or more, for repayment either of 1 2 limited tax levy general obligation bonds or of any county fund or account from which a loan was made, the proceeds from the bonds or loan 3 being used to pay for constructing, installing, improving, and 4 equipping stadium capital improvement projects, and to pay for any 5 engineering, planning, financial, legal and professional services 6 7 incident to the development of such stadium capital improvement projects, regardless of the date the debt for such capital improvement 8 projects was or may be incurred; (((ii))) (B) in any county with a 9 population of one million five hundred thousand or more, for repayment 10 or refinancing of bonded indebtedness incurred prior to January 1, 11 12 1997, for any purpose authorized by this section or relating to stadium 13 repairs or rehabilitation, including but not limited to the cost of 14 settling legal claims, reimbursing operating funds, interest payments on short-term loans, and any other purpose for which such debt has been 15 incurred if the county has created a public stadium authority to 16 17 develop a stadium and exhibition center under RCW 36.102.030; or ((((iii))) (C) in other counties, for county-owned facilities for 18 agricultural promotion until January 1, 2009, and thereafter for any 19 purpose authorized in this chapter. 20

21 (ii) A county is exempt under this subsection with respect to city 22 revenue or general obligation bonds issued after April 1, 1991, only if such bonds mature before January 1, 2013. <u>A county with a population</u> 23 24 of one million five hundred thousand or more is exempt under (a) of this subsection until January 1, 2021. If any county located east of 25 the crest of the Cascade mountains has levied the tax authorized by 26 27 this section and has, prior to June 26, 1975, pledged the tax revenue for payment of principal and interest on city revenue or general 28 obligation bonds, the county is exempt under this subsection with 29 respect to revenue or general obligation bonds issued after January 1, 30 2007, only if the bonds mature before January 1, ((2021)) <u>2035</u>. 31 Such 32 a county may only use funds under this subsection (2)(b) for constructing or improving facilities authorized under this chapter, 33 including county- owned facilities for agricultural promotion, and must 34 perform an annual financial audit of organizations receiving funding on 35 the use of the funds. 36

37 <u>(iii)</u> As used in this subsection (2)(b), "capital improvement 38 projects" may include, but not be limited to a stadium restaurant facility, restroom facilities, artificial turf system, seating facilities, parking facilities and scoreboard and information system adjacent to or within a county owned stadium, together with equipment, utilities, accessories and appurtenances necessary thereto. The stadium restaurant authorized by this subsection (2)(b) ((shall)) <u>must</u> be operated by a private concessionaire under a contract with the county.

8 (c)(i) No city within a county exempt under ((subsection (2))) (b) 9 of this ((section)) <u>subsection</u> may levy the tax authorized by this 10 section so long as said county is so exempt.

(ii) ((If-bonds-have-been-issued-under-RCW-43.99N.020-and-any necessary property transfers have been made under RCW 36.102.100,)) No city within a county with a population of one million <u>five_hundred</u> thousand or more may levy the tax authorized by this section ((before January 1, 2021)).

(iii) However, in the event that any city in a county described in 16 17 (c)(i) or (ii) of this subsection (2)(((c))) has levied the tax authorized by this section and has, prior to June 26, 1975, authorized 18 and issued revenue or general obligation bonds pursuant to the 19 provisions of RCW 67.28.150 through 67.28.160, such city may levy the 20 21 tax so long as the tax revenues are pledged for payment of principal 22 and interest on bonds issued at any time pursuant to the provisions of RCW 67.28.150 through 67.28.160. 23

24 (3) Any levy authorized by this section by a county that has 25 ((levied the tax authorized by this section and has, prior to June 26, 1975, -either-pledged-the-tax-revenues-for-payment-of-principal-and 26 27 interest-on-city-revenue-or-general-obligation-bonds-authorized-and issued pursuant to RCW 67.28.150 through 67.28.160 or has authorized 28 29 and - issued - revenue - or - general - obligation - bonds - pursuant - to - the provisions of RCW 67.28.150 through 67.28.160 shall be)) a population 30 of one million five hundred thousand or more is subject to the 31 32 following:

(a) Taxes collected under this section in any calendar year before
2013 in excess of five million three hundred thousand dollars ((shall))
may only be used as follows:

(i) ((Seventy five percent from January 1, 1992, through December
 37 31, 2000, and)) Seventy percent from January 1, 2001, through December
 38 31, 2012, for art museums, heritage and preservation programs, cultural

museums, heritage museums, <u>a performing arts center in a city with a</u> population greater than eighty-five thousand persons but less than one <u>hundred thousand persons</u>, the arts, and the performing arts. Moneys spent under this subsection (3)(a)(i) ((shall)) <u>must</u> be used for the purposes of this subsection (3)(a)(i) in all parts of the county.

(ii) ((Twenty-five percent from January 1, 1992, through December 6 7 31, 2000, and)) Thirty percent from January 1, 2001, through December 31, 2012, for the following purposes and in a manner reflecting the 8 following order of priority: Stadium purposes as authorized under 9 subsection (2)(b) of this section; acquisition of open space lands; 10 youth sports activities; and tourism promotion. If all or part of the 11 12 debt on the stadium is refinanced, all revenues under this subsection 13 (3)(a)(ii) ((shall)) must be used to retire the debt.

(b) From January 1, 2013, through December 31, 2015, ((in a county 14 with a population of one million or more,)) all revenues under this 15 section shall be used to retire the debt on the stadium, or deposited 16 in the stadium and exhibition center account under RCW 43.99N.060 after 17 the debt on the stadium is retired. On and after the date the debt on 18 the stadium is retired, and through December 31, 2015, one-half of the 19 revenues under this section in a county of one million five hundred 20 21 thousand or more must be deposited in the arts and cultural account under (d)(i) of this subsection, and the remainder of the revenues must 22 be deposited in the affordable workforce housing account under (d)(ii) 23 24 of this subsection.

(c) From January 1, 2016, through December 31, 2020, ((in a county with a population of one million or more,)) all revenues under this section shall be deposited in the stadium and exhibition center account under RCW 43.99N.060.

(d) ((At least seventy percent of moneys spent under (a)(i) of this 29 subsection for the period January 1, 1992, through December 31, 2000, 30 shall-be-used-only-for-the-purchase,-design,-construction,-and 31 32 remodeling-of-performing-arts,-visual-arts,-heritage,-and-cultural facilities, and for the purchase of fixed assets that will benefit art, 33 heritage, and cultural organizations. For purposes of this subsection, 34 35 fixed assets are tangible objects such as machinery and other equipment 36 intended to be held or used for ten years or more. Moneys received 37 under this subsection (3)(d) may be used for payment of principal and

interest — on — bonds — issued — for — capital — projects. Qualifying 1 2 organizations-receiving-moneys-under-this-subsection-(3)(d)-must-be financially stable and have at least the following: 3 4 (i) A legally constituted and working board of directors; (ii) A record of artistic, heritage, or cultural accomplishments; 5 (iii) Been in existence and operating for at least two years; 6 7 (iv) Demonstrated ability to maintain net current liabilities at 8 less than thirty percent of general operating expenses; 9 (v) Demonstrated ability to sustain operational capacity subsequent 10 to completion of projects or purchase of machinery and equipment; and 11 (vi) Evidence that there has been independent financial review of the organization.)) On and after January 1, 2021, revenues under this 12 section in a county of one million five hundred thousand or more must 13 be deposited as follows: 14 (i) <u>At least thirty-seven and one-half percent of the revenues</u> 15 shall be deposited in an arts and cultural account. The account may 16 only be used for the purposes of (a)(i) of this subsection. 17 (ii) At least thirty-seven and one-half percent of the revenues 18 shall be deposited in an affordable workforce housing account for the 19 purposes of distributions to nonprofit organizations or public housing 20 21 authorities for affordable workforce housing near or at transit

stations. For the purposes of this section, "affordable workforce 22 housing <u>means</u> housing for a single person, family, or unrelated 23 24 persons living together whose income is at or below eighty percent of the median income, adjusted for household size, for the county where 25 26 the housing is located. These funds may only be used to fund the portions of affordable workforce housing projects that are to be 27 occupied by households earning less than eighty percent of area median 28 income. These funds may be used as a subsidy under the Washington 29 works housing program created in RCW 43.180.160(2)(a) (section 2, 30 chapter ... (ESHB 2753), Laws of 2010). 31

32 (iii) The balance of the revenues must be deposited in a special 33 purposes account under subsection (5) of this section.

(e) At least forty percent of the revenues distributed pursuant to
(a)(i) of this subsection for the period January 1, 2001, through
((December 31, 2012, shall be deposited in an account and shall be used
to-establish-an-endowment. Principal-in-the-account-shall-remain
permanent and irreducible. The earnings from investments of balances

in the account may only be used for the purposes of (a)(i) of this
subsection)) the effective date of this act shall be deposited in an
arts and cultural account under (d)(i) of this subsection.

4 (f) School districts and schools ((shall)) may not receive revenues
5 distributed pursuant to (a)(i) of this subsection.

6 (g) Moneys distributed to art museums, cultural museums, heritage 7 museums, the arts, and the performing arts, and moneys distributed for 8 tourism promotion ((shall be)) are in addition to and may not be used 9 to replace or supplant any other funding by the legislative body of the 10 county.

As used in this section, "tourism promotion" includes 11 (h) activities intended to attract visitors for overnight stays, arts, 12 heritage, and cultural events, and recreational, professional, and 13 amateur sports events. Moneys allocated to tourism promotion in a 14 class AA county ((shall)) must be allocated to nonprofit organizations 15 formed for the express purpose of tourism promotion in the county. 16 17 Such organizations ((shall)) must use moneys from the taxes to promote events in all parts of the class AA county. 18

(i) No taxes collected under this section may be used for the 19 operation or maintenance of a public stadium that is financed directly 20 or indirectly by bonds to which the tax is pledged. Expenditures for 21 22 operation or maintenance include all expenditures other than 23 expenditures that directly result in new fixed assets or that directly 24 increase the capacity, life span, or operating economy of existing fixed assets. 25

(j) No ad valorem property taxes may be used for debt service on bonds issued for a public stadium that is financed by bonds to which the tax is pledged, unless the taxes collected under this section are or are projected to be insufficient to meet debt service requirements on such bonds.

(k) If a substantial part of the operation and management of a public stadium that is financed directly or indirectly by bonds to which the tax is pledged is performed by a nonpublic entity or if a public stadium is sold that is financed directly or indirectly by bonds to which the tax is pledged, any bonds to which the tax is pledged ((shall)) must be retired. This subsection (3)(k) does not apply in respect to a public stadium under chapter 36.102 RCW transferred to, owned by, or constructed by a public facilities district under chapter
 36.100 RCW or a stadium and exhibition center.

3 (1) The county ((shall)) may not lease a public stadium that is 4 financed directly or indirectly by bonds to which the tax is pledged 5 to, or authorize the use of the public stadium by, a professional major 6 league sports franchise unless the sports franchise gives the right of 7 first refusal to purchase the sports franchise, upon its sale, to local 8 government. This subsection (3)(1) does not apply to contracts in 9 existence on April 1, 1986.

10 (m) Notwithstanding the distributions under (b) and (c) of this 11 subsection, from January 1, 2013, through December 31, 2015, taxes 12 derived from the exemption provided in subsection (2)(b)(ii) of this 13 section for counties with a population of one million five hundred 14 thousand or more must be used to retire the debt on the stadium as 15 provided in (b) of this subsection and deposited in the special 16 purposes account created in subsection (5) of this section thereafter.

17 <u>(4)</u> If a court of competent jurisdiction declares any provision of 18 ((this)) subsection (3) <u>of this section</u> invalid, then that invalid 19 provision ((shall-be)) <u>is</u> null and void and the remainder of this 20 section is not affected.

21 (5)(a) Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section, money
22 deposited in a special purposes account under this section may be used
23 only for one or more of the following purposes within the county:

24 <u>(i) Funding nonprofit organizations providing public health</u>
25 <u>services;</u>

26 (ii) Funding nonprofit organizations providing human service 27 programs;

28 (iii) Funding tourism promotion as defined in RCW 67.28.080;

29 (iv) Funding youth or amateur sports activities or facilities;

30 <u>(v) Funding regional centers;</u>

31 (vi) Funding performing arts centers;

32 (vii) Funding community preservation and development authorities
33 created in chapter 43.167 RCW; or

34 <u>(viii) Notwithstanding and superseding any other sections or</u> 35 provisions of this legislation, funding capital replacement and 36 improvements to existing public stadium facilities that are:

37 <u>(A) Owned by a public stadium authority or public facility</u>

1 district, provided that the board of the district or authority has 2 certified that the capital replacement or improvements are necessary; 3 or

4 <u>(B) Not owned by a public stadium authority or public facility</u> 5 <u>district, provided that the capital replacement or improvement is for</u> 6 <u>the remediation of seismic or other unsafe conditions or to ensure</u> 7 <u>compliance with the Americans with disabilities act, revised building</u> 8 <u>code, or construction standards.</u>

9 (b) Beginning in calendar year 2012, an amount equal to twenty-five 10 cents for each admission to any commercial event at a stadium developed 11 by a public facilities district under chapter 36.100 RCW or a stadium 12 and exhibition center developed by a public stadium authority under 13 chapter 36.102 RCW, shall be deposited into the community preservation 14 and development authority account created in RCW 43.167.040.

15 (c) Beginning in calendar year 2012 and until December 31, 2020, 16 three million one hundred seventy thousand dollars must be transferred 17 annually to the affordable workforce housing account described in 18 subsection (3)(d)(ii) of this section.

19 (d) Beginning in calendar year 2012 and until December 31, 2020, 20 three million one hundred seventy thousand dollars must be deposited in 21 the arts and cultural account. The account may only be used for the 22 purposes of subsection (3)(a)(i) of this section.

23 **Sec. 2.** RCW 82.14.049 and 2008 c 264 s 4 are each amended to read 24 as follows:

The legislative authority of any county may impose a sales and use 25 26 tax, in addition to the tax authorized by RCW 82.14.030, upon retail 27 car rentals within the county that are taxable by the state under chapters 82.08 and 82.12 RCW. The rate of tax ((shall-be)) is one 28 percent of the selling price in the case of a sales tax or rental value 29 of the vehicle in the case of a use tax. Proceeds of the tax ((shall)) 30 31 may not be used to subsidize any professional sports team and ((shall)) <u>must</u> be used solely for the following purposes: 32

33 (1) Acquiring, constructing, maintaining, or operating public34 sports stadium facilities;

35 (2) Engineering, planning, financial, legal, or professional
 36 services incidental to public sports stadium facilities;

37

(3) Youth or amateur sport activities or facilities; ((or))

(4) Debt or refinancing debt issued for the purposes of subsection
 (1) of this section; or

3 <u>(5) For deposit into a special purposes account under RCW</u> 4 <u>67.28.180(5)</u>.

In a county with a population less than one million five hundred 5 thousand, at least seventy-five percent of the tax imposed under this 6 7 section shall be used for the purposes of subsections (1), (2), and (4)of this section. In a county of one million five hundred thousand or 8 more, at least seventy-five percent of the tax imposed under this 9 section shall be used to retire the debt on the stadium under RCW 10 67.28.180(2)(b)(ii), until that debt is fully retired, and at least 11 seventy-five percent must be deposited under subsection (5) of this 12 13 section after the debt is fully retired.

 RCW 82.14.360 and 2008 c 86 s 104 are each amended to read

 15
 as follows:

16 (1) The legislative authority of a county with a population of one million five hundred thousand or more may impose a special stadium 17 sales and use tax upon the retail sale or use within the county by 18 restaurants, taverns, and bars of food and beverages that are taxable 19 by the state under chapters 82.08 and 82.12 RCW. The rate of the tax 20 21 ((shall)) may not exceed five-tenths of one percent of the selling price in the case of a sales tax, or value of the article used in the 22 23 case of a use tax. The tax authorized under this subsection is in 24 addition to any other taxes authorized by law and ((shall)) may not be credited against any other tax imposed upon the same taxable event. 25 As 26 used in this section, "restaurant" does not include grocery stores, mini-markets, or convenience stores. <u>A county may not impose the tax</u> 27 authorized in this subsection after December 31, 2015. 28

(2) The legislative authority of a county with a population of one 29 30 million five hundred thousand or more may impose a special stadium 31 sales and use tax upon retail car rentals within the county that are taxable by the state under chapters 82.08 and 82.12 RCW. The rate of 32 the tax ((shall)) may not exceed two percent of the selling price in 33 the case of a sales tax, or rental value of the vehicle in the case of 34 a use tax. The tax imposed under this subsection is in addition to any 35 36 other taxes authorized by law and ((shall)) may not be credited against 37 any other tax imposed upon the same taxable event.

(3)(a) Except as provided in (b) of this subsection, the revenue 1 2 from the taxes imposed under the authority of this section ((shall)) must be used for the purpose of principal and interest payments on 3 bonds, issued by the county, to acquire, construct, own, remodel, 4 maintain, equip, reequip, repair, and operate a baseball stadium. 5 Revenues from the taxes authorized in this section may be used for 6 7 design and other preconstruction costs of the baseball stadium until bonds are issued for the baseball stadium. 19 (((b))) (<u>ii</u>) If the revenue from the taxes imposed under this 20 section exceeds the amount needed for the purposes in (a)(<u>i</u>) of this 21 subsection in any year, the excess ((shall)) <u>must</u> be placed in a 22 contingency fund which may only be used to pay unanticipated capital 23 costs on the baseball stadium, excluding any cost overruns on initial 24 construction.

RCW 36.38.010 and 1999 c 165 s 20 are each amended to read
2 as follows:

(1) Any county may by ordinance enacted by its county legislative 3 authority, levy and fix a tax of not more than one cent on twenty cents 4 5 or fraction thereof to be paid for county purposes by persons who pay an admission charge to any place, including a tax on persons who are 6 7 admitted free of charge or at reduced rates to any place for which other persons pay a charge or a regular higher charge for the same or 8 9 similar privileges or accommodations; and require that one who receives any admission charge to any place ((shall)) must collect and remit the 10 tax to the county treasurer of the county((: PROVIDED,)). If the revenue from the tax exceeds the amount 8 9 needed for that purpose, the excess ((shall)) <u>must</u> be placed in a contingency fund which ((may only)) must be used ((to pay unanticipated 10 capital costs on the baseball stadium, excluding any cost overruns on 11 initial construction)) exclusively by the public facilities district to 12 13 fund_repair, reequipping, and capital improvement_of_the_baseball 14 stadium; and

(b) Not more than one cent on twenty cents or fraction thereof, to be used for the purpose of paying the principal and interest payments on bonds issued by a county to construct a baseball stadium as defined in RCW 82.14.0485. The tax imposed under this subsection (4)(b) ((shall)) expires when the bonds issued for the construction of the baseball stadium are retired, but not later than twenty years after the tax is first collected.

22 (5) Notwithstanding subsection (3) of this section, the legislative authority of a county that has created a public stadium authority to 23 24 develop a stadium and exhibition center under RCW 36.102.050 may levy 25 and fix a tax on charges for admission to events in a stadium and exhibition center, as defined in RCW 36.102.010, constructed in the 26 27 county on or after January 1, 1998, that is owned by a public stadium authority under chapter 36.102 RCW. The tax ((shall be)) is exclusive 28 and ((shall)) precludes the city or town within which the stadium and 29 exhibition center is located from imposing a tax of the same or similar 30 31 kind on charges for admission to events in the stadium and exhibition 32 center, and ((shall)) precludes the imposition of a general county admissions tax on charges for admission to events in the stadium and 33 exhibition center. For the purposes of this subsection, "charges for 34 admission to events" means only the actual admission charge, exclusive 35 of taxes and service charges and the value of any other benefit 36 37 conferred by the admission. The tax authorized under this subsection 38 ((shall)) <u>must</u> be at the rate of not more than one cent on ten cents or

fraction thereof. Revenues collected under this subsection ((shall)) 1 2 must be deposited in the stadium and exhibition center account under RCW 43.99N.060 until the bonds issued under RCW 43.99N.020 for the 3 construction of the stadium and exhibition center are retired. After 4 the bonds issued for the construction of the stadium and exhibition 5 center are retired, the tax authorized under this section ((shall)) 6 7 must be used exclusively to fund repair, reequipping, and capital improvement of the stadium and exhibition center. The tax under this 8 subsection may be levied upon the first use of any part of the stadium 9 10 and exhibition center but ((shall)) may not be collected at any facility already in operation as of July 17, 1997. 11

12 **Sec. 5.** RCW 36.100.220 and 1999 c 165 s 18 are each amended to 13 read as follows:

A public facility district may levy and fix a tax on any vehicle 14 parking charges imposed at any parking facility that is owned or leased 15 16 by the public facility district as part of a regional center, as defined in RCW 35.57.020, or a baseball stadium, as defined in RCW 17 82.14.0485. No county ((or)), city, or town within which the regional 18 center or baseball stadium is located may impose a tax of the same or 19 20 similar kind on any vehicle parking charges at the facility. For the 21 purposes of this section, "vehicle parking charges" means only the actual parking charges exclusive of taxes and service charges and the 22 23 value of any other benefit conferred. The tax authorized under this section ((shall)) must be at the rate of not more than ten percent. 24 The tax authorized by this section with respect to a parking facility 25 26 associated with a baseball stadium must be used exclusively to fund 27 repair, reequipping, and capital improvement of the baseball stadium, and is not subject to the requirements of RCW 36.100.010(4). 28

NEW SECTION. Sec. 6. This act takes effect July 1, 2010."

1 On page 1, line 3 of the title, after "1975;" strike the remainder 2 of the title and insert "amending RCW 67.28.180, 82.14.049, 82.14.360, 3 36.38.010, and 36.100.220; and providing an effective date."

EFFECT: Provides specific funding to arts and cultural organizations, affordable workforce housing, and community development authorities. The allowed uses of the special purpose fund includes capital improvement to facilities owned by a public stadium authority or a public facilities district. Additionally the funds may be used for other public stadiums for remediation of seismic or other unsafe conditions or to ensure compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act or revised building code or construction standards. Yakima County can continue to collect the hotel motel tax in the city of Yakima until 2035.

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
