1           AN ACT Relating to protecting children from sexual exploitation and  
2 abuse; amending RCW 9.68.001, 9.68A.110, 9.68A.011, 9.68A.050,  
3 9.68A.060, and 9.68A.070; reenacting and amending RCW 9.94A.515; adding  
4 a new section to chapter 9.68A RCW; and prescribing penalties.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6           **Sec. 1.** RCW 9.68A.001 and 2007 c 368 s 1 are each amended to read  
7 as follows:

8           The legislature finds that the prevention of sexual exploitation  
9 and abuse of children constitutes a government objective of surpassing  
10 importance. The care of children is a sacred trust and should not be  
11 abused by those who seek commercial gain or personal gratification  
12 based on the exploitation of children.

13           The legislature further finds that the protection of children from  
14 sexual exploitation can be accomplished without infringing on a  
15 constitutionally protected activity. The definition of "sexually  
16 explicit conduct" and other operative definitions demarcate a line  
17 between protected and prohibited conduct and should not inhibit  
18 legitimate scientific, medical, or educational activities.

1 The legislature further finds that children engaged in sexual  
2 conduct for financial compensation are frequently the victims of sexual  
3 abuse. Approximately eighty to ninety percent of children engaged in  
4 sexual activity for financial compensation have a history of sexual  
5 abuse victimization. It is the intent of the legislature to encourage  
6 these children to engage in prevention and intervention services and to  
7 hold those who pay to engage in the sexual abuse of children  
8 accountable for the trauma they inflict on children.

9 The legislature further finds that due to the changing nature of  
10 technology, offenders are now able to access child pornography in  
11 different ways and in increasing quantities. By amending current  
12 statutes governing depictions of a minor engaged in sexually explicit  
13 conduct, it is the intent of the legislature to ensure that intentional  
14 viewing of and trading in child pornography over the internet is  
15 subject to a criminal penalty without limiting the scope of existing  
16 prohibitions on the possession of or dealing in child pornography,  
17 including the possession of electronic depictions of a minor engaged in  
18 sexually explicit conduct. It is also the intent of the legislature to  
19 clarify, in response to State v. Sutherby, 204 P.3d 916 (2009), and  
20 other recent case law, that each individual item of visual or printed  
21 matter constitutes a separate violation for purposes of determining the  
22 unit of prosecution under the statutes governing possession of and  
23 trading in depictions of a minor engaged in sexually explicit conduct.  
24 Furthermore, it is the intent of the legislature to set a different  
25 unit of prosecution for the new crime of intentionally viewing over the  
26 internet a visual or printed matter depicting a minor engaged in  
27 sexually explicit conduct such that each separate internet session of  
28 intentionally viewing over the internet of a visual or printed matter  
29 depicting a minor engaged in sexually explicit conduct constitutes a  
30 separate offense.

31 **Sec. 2.** RCW 9.68A.110 and 2007 c 368 s 3 are each amended to read  
32 as follows:

33 (1) In a prosecution under RCW 9.68A.040, it is not a defense that  
34 the defendant was involved in activities of law enforcement and  
35 prosecution agencies in the investigation and prosecution of criminal  
36 offenses. Law enforcement and prosecution agencies shall not employ

1 minors to aid in the investigation of a violation of RCW 9.68A.090 or  
2 9.68A.100. This chapter does not apply to lawful conduct between  
3 spouses.

4 (2) In a prosecution under RCW 9.68A.050, 9.68A.060, 9.68A.070, or  
5 9.68A.080, it is not a defense that the defendant did not know the age  
6 of the child depicted in the visual or printed matter: PROVIDED, That  
7 it is a defense, which the defendant must prove by a preponderance of  
8 the evidence, that at the time of the offense the defendant was not in  
9 possession of any facts on the basis of which he or she should  
10 reasonably have known that the person depicted was a minor.

11 (3) In a prosecution under RCW 9.68A.040, 9.68A.090, 9.68A.101, or  
12 9.68A.102, it is not a defense that the defendant did not know the  
13 alleged victim's age: PROVIDED, That it is a defense, which the  
14 defendant must prove by a preponderance of the evidence, that at the  
15 time of the offense, the defendant made a reasonable bona fide attempt  
16 to ascertain the true age of the minor by requiring production of a  
17 driver's license, marriage license, birth certificate, or other  
18 governmental or educational identification card or paper and did not  
19 rely solely on the oral allegations or apparent age of the minor.

20 (4) In a prosecution under RCW 9.68A.050, 9.68A.060, or 9.68A.070,  
21 it shall be an affirmative defense that the defendant was a law  
22 enforcement officer or a person specifically authorized, in writing, to  
23 assist a law enforcement officer and acting at the direction of a law  
24 enforcement officer in the process of conducting an official  
25 investigation of a sex-related crime against a minor, or that the  
26 defendant was providing individual case treatment as a recognized  
27 medical facility or as a psychiatrist or psychologist licensed under  
28 Title 18 RCW. Nothing in this act is intended to in any way affect or  
29 diminish the immunity afforded an electronic communication service  
30 provider, remote computing service provider, or domain name registrar  
31 acting in the performance of its reporting or preservation  
32 responsibilities under 18 U.S.C. Secs. 2258a, 2258b, or 2258c.

33 (5) In a prosecution under RCW 9.68A.050, 9.68A.060, or 9.68A.070,  
34 the state is not required to establish the identity of the alleged  
35 victim.

36 **Sec. 3.** RCW 9.68A.011 and 2002 c 70 s 1 are each amended to read  
37 as follows:

1 Unless the context clearly indicates otherwise, the definitions in  
2 this section apply throughout this chapter.

3 (1) An "internet session" means a period of time during which an  
4 internet user using a specific internet protocol address visits or is  
5 logged into an internet site for a sequential and uninterrupted period  
6 of time.

7 (2) To "photograph" means to make a print, negative, slide, digital  
8 image, motion picture, or videotape. A "photograph" means anything  
9 tangible or intangible produced by photographing.

10 ((+2)) (3) "Visual or printed matter" means ((any)) a photograph  
11 or other material that contains a reproduction of a photograph.

12 ((+3)) (4) "Sexually explicit conduct" means actual or simulated:

13 (a) Sexual intercourse, including genital-genital, oral-genital,  
14 anal-genital, or oral-anal, whether between persons of the same or  
15 opposite sex or between humans and animals;

16 (b) Penetration of the vagina or rectum by any object;

17 (c) Masturbation;

18 (d) Sadomasochistic abuse for the purpose of sexual stimulation of  
19 the viewer;

20 (e) ((Exhibition)) Depiction of the genitals or unclothed pubic or  
21 rectal areas of any minor, or the unclothed breast of a female minor,  
22 for the purpose of sexual stimulation of the viewer. For purposes of  
23 this subsection (4)(e), it is not necessary that the minor know that he  
24 or she is participating in the described conduct, or any aspect of it;

25 (f) Defecation or urination for the purpose of sexual stimulation  
26 of the viewer; and

27 (g) Touching of a person's clothed or unclothed genitals, pubic  
28 area, buttocks, or breast area for the purpose of sexual stimulation of  
29 the viewer.

30 ((+4)) (5) "Minor" means any person under eighteen years of age.

31 ((+5)) (6) "Live performance" means any play, show, skit, dance,  
32 or other exhibition performed or presented to or before an audience of  
33 one or more, with or without consideration.

34 **Sec. 4.** RCW 9.68A.050 and 1989 c 32 s 3 are each amended to read  
35 as follows:

36 A person who:

1 (1) Knowingly develops, duplicates, publishes, prints,  
2 disseminates, exchanges, finances, attempts to finance, or sells  
3 ((any)) a visual or printed matter that depicts a minor engaged in an  
4 act of sexually explicit conduct; or

5 (2) Possesses with intent to develop, duplicate, publish, print,  
6 disseminate, exchange, or sell ((any)) a visual or printed matter that  
7 depicts a minor engaged in an act of sexually explicit conduct  
8 is guilty of a class C felony punishable under chapter 9A.20 RCW.

9 (3) For the purposes of this section, each depiction or image of  
10 visual or printed matter constitutes a separate offense.

11 **Sec. 5.** RCW 9.68A.060 and 1989 c 32 s 4 are each amended to read  
12 as follows:

13 (1) A person who knowingly sends or causes to be sent, or brings or  
14 causes to be brought, into this state for sale or distribution, ((any))  
15 a visual or printed matter that depicts a minor engaged in sexually  
16 explicit conduct is guilty of a class C felony punishable under chapter  
17 9A.20 RCW.

18 (2) For the purposes of this section, each depiction or image of  
19 visual or printed matter constitutes a separate offense.

20 **Sec. 6.** RCW 9.68A.070 and 2006 c 139 s 3 are each amended to read  
21 as follows:

22 (1) A person who knowingly possesses a visual or printed matter  
23 depicting a minor engaged in sexually explicit conduct is guilty of a  
24 class B felony.

25 (2) For the purposes of this section, each depiction or image of  
26 visual or printed matter constitutes a separate offense.

27 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7.** A new section is added to chapter 9.68A RCW  
28 to read as follows:

29 (1) A person who intentionally views over the internet visual or  
30 printed matter depicting a minor engaged in sexually explicit conduct  
31 is guilty of a class B felony. For purposes of determining whether a  
32 person intentionally viewed over the internet a visual or printed  
33 matter depicting a minor engaged in sexually explicit conduct, the  
34 trier of fact shall consider the title, text, and content of the visual  
35 or printed matter, as well as the internet history, search terms,

1 thumbnail images, downloading activity, expert computer forensic  
2 testimony, number of visual or printed matters depicting minors engaged  
3 in sexually explicit conduct, defendant's access to and control over  
4 the electronic device and its contents upon which the visual or printed  
5 matter was found, or any other relevant evidence.

6 (2) For purposes of this section, each separate internet session of  
7 intentionally viewing over the internet visual or printed matter  
8 depicting a minor engaged in sexually explicit conduct constitutes a  
9 separate offense.

10 (3) This section shall not be construed to authorize warrantless  
11 internet surveillance by a commissioned law enforcement officer in the  
12 process of conducting an official investigation of a sex-related crime  
13 against a minor if the surveillance would violate Article I, section 7  
14 of the state Constitution.
