AN ACT Relating to economic stimulus transportation funding and appropriations; creating new sections; making appropriations and authorizing capital improvements; and declaring an emergency.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

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17 18 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. (1) It is the intent of the governor and the legislature to stimulate Washington's lagging economy and reduce the state's unemployment rate by quickly putting people to work on infrastructure projects that will promote safety, relieve traffic congestion, and make long-term investments that will provide benefits into the future. Such projects must be constructed quickly and generate a significant number of jobs in order to strengthen the economy and assist those seeking work. To that end, eighteen pavement preservation projects with an estimated value of \$98 million and transportation improvement projects valued at more than \$292 million will be advanced and go to advertisement no later than June 30, 2009.

(2) This economic stimulus transportation budget is hereby adopted and, subject to the provisions set forth, the amounts specified, or as much thereof as may be necessary to accomplish the purposes designated,
