- 1 AN ACT Relating to cost savings on course materials; and amending
- 2 RCW 28B.10.590.

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- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 28B.10.590 and 2007 c 457 s 1 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
 - (1) The boards of regents of the state universities, the boards of trustees of the regional universities and The Evergreen State College, and the boards of trustees of each community and technical college district, in collaboration with affiliated bookstores and student and faculty representatives, shall adopt rules requiring that:
- 11 (a) Affiliated bookstores:
- (i) Provide students the option of purchasing materials that are unbundled when possible, disclose to faculty and staff the costs to students of purchasing materials, and disclose publicly how new editions vary from previous editions;
- 16 (ii) Actively promote and publicize book buy-back programs; ((and))
- 17 (iii) Disclose retail costs for course materials on a per course
- 18 basis to faculty and staff and make this information publicly
- 19 available; and

- (iv) Disclose information to students on required course materials 1 including but not limited to title, authors, edition, price, and 2 International Standard Book Number (ISBN) at least four weeks before 3 the start of the class for which the materials are required. The chief 4 academic officer may waive the disclosure requirement provided in this 5 subsection (1)(a)(iv), on a case-by-case basis, if students may 6 reasonably expect that nearly all information regarding course 7 materials is available four weeks before the start of the class for 8 which the materials are required. The requirement provided in this 9 subsection (1)(a)(iv) does not apply if the faculty member using the 10 course materials is hired four weeks or less before the start of class; 11 12 and
 - (b) Faculty and staff members consider the least costly practices in assigning course materials, such as adopting the least expensive edition available, adopting free, open textbooks when available, and working with college librarians to put together collections of free online web and library resources, when educational content is comparable as determined by the faculty ((and-working-closely-with publishers and local bookstores to create bundles and packages if they deliver cost savings to students)).
 - (2) As used in this section:
- 22 (a) "Materials" means any supplies or texts required or recommended 23 by faculty or staff for a given course.
- 24 (b) "Bundled" means a group of objects joined together by packaging 25 or required to be purchased as an indivisible unit.
