3 "NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** (1) A capital budget is hereby adopted and,
4 subject to the provisions set forth in this act, the several dollar
5 amounts hereinafter specified, or so much thereof as shall be
6 sufficient to accomplish the purposes designated, are hereby
7 appropriated and authorized to be incurred for capital projects during
8 the period beginning with the effective date of this act and ending
9 June 30, 2013, out of the several funds specified in this act.

10 (2) The definitions in this subsection apply throughout this act
11 unless the context clearly requires otherwise.

12 (a) "Fiscal year 2012" or "FY 2012" means the period beginning July
13 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2012.

14 (b) "Fiscal year 2013" or "FY 2013" means the period beginning July
15 1, 2012, and ending June 30, 2013.

16 (c) "Lapse" or "revert" means the amount shall return to an
17 unappropriated status.

18 (d) "Provided solely" means the specified amount may be spent only
19 for the specified purpose.

20 (3) The appropriations in this act are appropriations for capital
21 purposes from sources other than bond proceeds. Appropriations in this
22 act may not necessarily represent all expenditures authorized for a
23 particular project for the 2011-2013 fiscal biennium. For some
24 projects receiving appropriations in this act, additional
25 appropriations from other sources for those projects may also be
26 contained in chapter, Laws of 2011 (House Bill No. 2020).

27 (4) Unless otherwise specifically authorized in this act, any
28 portion of an amount provided solely for a specified purpose that is
29 not expended subject to the specified conditions and limitations to
30 fulfill the specified purpose shall lapse.

1 (5) The amounts shown under the headings "Prior Biennia," "Future
2 Biennia," and "Total" in this act are for informational purposes only
3 and do not constitute legislative approval of these amounts. "Prior
4 biennia" typically refers to the immediate prior biennium for
5 reappropriations, but may refer to multiple biennia in the case of
6 specific projects. A "future biennia" amount is an estimate of what
7 may be appropriated for the project or program in the 2011-2013
8 biennium and the following three biennia; an amount of zero does not
9 necessarily constitute legislative intent to not provide funding for
10 the project or program in the future.

11 (6) "Reappropriations" in this act are appropriations and, unless
12 the context clearly provides otherwise, are subject to the relevant
13 conditions and limitations applicable to appropriations.
14 Reappropriations shall be limited to the unexpended balances remaining
15 on June 30, 2011, from the 2009-2011 biennial appropriations for each
16 project.

3 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7001.** (1) Allotments for appropriations in this
4 act shall be provided in accordance with the capital project review
5 requirements adopted by the office of financial management and in
6 compliance with RCW 43.88.110. Projects that will be employing

1 legislature. Minor works projects are intended to be one-time
2 expenditures that do not require future state resources to complete.

34 contracting as allowed in chapter 39.35A RCW shall be the means of

1 project delivery for all applicable systems or structural improvements.
2 The program shall at a minimum include the following: (1) Guidelines
3 for developing a prequalified list of energy services contractors
4 eligible for selection to lead or participate on a team to design and
5 construct a new building, or renovate a building; (2) a process for
6 evaluating the projects submitted by school districts to determine if
7 they are candidates for the pilot; (3) a model contract that requires
8 a guarantee of system performance by way of ongoing monitoring and
9 verification of energy measures to be used in the building; and (4) any
10 rule making or oversight that the department of general administration
11 considers necessary for the success of the pilot program. The pilot
12 program recommendations shall be delivered to the house capital budget
13 committee and the senate ways and means committee by January 1, 2012.

14 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7011. ACQUISITION OF PROPERTIES AND FACILITIES**
15 **THROUGH FINANCIAL CONTRACTS**

16 The following agencies may enter into financial contracts, paid
17 from any funds of an agency, appropriated or nonappropriated, for the
18 purposes indicated and in not more than the principal amounts
19 indicated, plus financing expenses and required reserves pursuant to
20 chapter 39.94 RCW. When securing properties under this section,
21 agencies shall use the most economical financial contract option
22 available, including long-term leases, lease-purchase agreements,
23 lease-development with option to purchase agreements or financial
24 contracts using certificates of participation. Expenditures made by an
25 agency for one of the indicated purposes before the issue date of the
26 authorized financial contract and any certificates of participation
27 therein are intended to be reimbursed from proceeds of the financial
28 contract and any certificates of participation therein to the extent
29 provided in the agency's financing plan approved by the state finance
30 committee.

31 State agencies may enter into agreements with the department of
32 general administration and the state treasurer's office to develop
33 requests to the legislature for acquisition of properties and
34 facilities through financial contracts. The agreements may include
35 charges for services rendered.

36 Those noninstructional facilities of higher education institutions
37 authorized in this section to enter into financial contracts are not

1 eligible for state funded maintenance and operations. Instructional
2 space that is available for regularly scheduled classes for academic
3 transfer, basic skills, and workforce training programs may be eligible
4 for state funded maintenance and operations.

5 (1) Community and technical colleges:

6 (a) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Columbia basin
7 college for up to \$2,500,000 plus financing and required reserves
8 pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to add space to the delta high school for
9 the science technology engineering math program.

10 (b) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Peninsula college
11 for up to \$2,000,000 plus financing expenses and required reserves
12 pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to renovate the Forks Satellite building.

13 (c) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Peninsula college
14 for up to \$800,000 plus financing expenses and required reserves
15 pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to build a wellness center on the Port
16 Angeles campus.

17 (d) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Walla Walla
18 Community College for up to \$1,000,000 plus financing expenses and
19 required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to purchase up to 40
20 acres of land.

21 (e) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Walla Walla
22 Community College for up to \$1,000,000 plus financing expenses and
23 required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW for the water and
24 environment center.

25 (f) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Wenatchee Valley
26 Community College for up to \$2,700,000 plus financing expenses and
27 required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to construct a music
28 and art center.

29 (g) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Whatcom community
30 college for up to \$3,916,000 plus financing expenses and required
31 reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to build an auxiliary services
32 building.

33 (2) Central Washington University: Enter into a financing contract
34 for up to \$2,500,000 plus financing and required reserves pursuant to
35 chapter 39.94 RCW to purchase the Albertsons's building.

36 (3) Department of general administration:

37 (a) Enter into a financing contract for up to \$6,000,000 plus

1 financing expenses and required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW
2 for the rehabilitation of the John L. O'Brien building.

3 (b) Enter into a financing contract for up to \$250,000 plus
4 financing expenses and required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW
5 for the "Perry Street child care site" land purchase.

6 (4) Department of social and health services: Enter into a
7 financing contract for up to \$15,850,000 plus financing expenses and
8 required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to construct or
9 renovate specialized housing and treatment facilities for youth
10 committed to the juvenile rehabilitation administration. The debt
11 service is to be paid with the savings associated with closure of the
12 Maple Lane school.

13 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7012. PUGET SOUND PROTECTION AND RESTORATION**

14 Consistent with RCW 90.71.340, when expending appropriations under
15 this act that contribute to Puget Sound protection and recovery,
16 agencies shall consult with the Puget Sound partnership to ensure that
17 projects and expenditures are either in, or consistent with the 2020
18 action agenda. These consultations shall include the exchange of
19 information on specific actions, projects, associated funding,
20 performance measures, and other information necessary to track project
21 implementation and ensure alignment with the action agenda. In
22 situations where the Puget Sound partnership finds that a project is
23 not in, or is not consistent with the action agenda Puget Sound
24 partnership shall document this finding and report back to the governor
25 and legislative fiscal committees.

26 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7013. FOR THE ARTS COMMISSION--ART WORK**
27 **ALLOWANCE POOLING**

28 (1) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this act for
29 original construction of school plant facilities may be expended for
30 the purposes of RCW 28A.335.210. The Washington state arts commission
31 may combine the proceeds from individual projects in order to fund
32 larger works of art or mobile art displays in consultation with the
33 superintendent of public instruction and representatives of school
34 district boards.

35 (2) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this act for
36 original construction or any major renovation or remodel work exceeding

1 two hundred thousand dollars by colleges or universities may be
2 expended for the purposes of RCW 28B.10.027. The Washington state arts
3 commission may combine the proceeds from individual projects in order
4 to fund larger works of art or mobile art displays in consultation with
5 the board of regents or trustees.

6 (3) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this act for
7 original construction of any public building by a state agency as
8 defined in RCW 43.17.020 may be expended for the purposes of RCW
9 43.17.200. The Washington state arts commission may combine the
10 proceeds from individual projects in order to fund larger works of art
11 or mobile art displays in consultation with the state agency.

12 (4) At least eighty-five percent of the moneys spent by the
13 Washington state arts commission during the 2011-2013 biennium for the
14 purposes of RCW 28A.335.210, 28B.10.027, and 43.17.200 must be expended
15 solely for direct acquisition of works of art. The commission may use
16 up to \$100,000 of this amount to conserve or maintain existing pieces
17 in the state art collection pursuant to chapter 36, Laws of 2005.

18 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7014.** To carry out the provisions of this act,
19 the governor may assign responsibility for predesign, design,
20 construction, and other related activities to any appropriate agency.

21 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7015.** If any federal moneys appropriated by
22 this act for capital projects are not received by the state, the
23 department or agency to which the moneys were appropriated may replace
24 the federal moneys with funds available from private or local sources.
25 No replacement may occur under this section without the prior approval
26 of the director of financial management in consultation with the senate
27 ways and means committee and the house of representatives capital
28 budget committee.

29 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7016.** (1) Unless otherwise stated, for all
30 appropriations under this act that require a match of nonstate money or
31 in-kind contributions, the following requirement, consistent with RCW
32 43.88.150, shall apply: Expenditures of state money shall be timed so
33 that the state share of project expenditures never exceeds the intended
34 state share of total project costs.

1 (2) Provision of the full amount of required matching funds is not
2 required to permit the expenditure of capital budget appropriations for
3 phased projects if a proportional amount of the required matching funds
4 is provided for each distinct, identifiable phase of the project.

5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7017.** A new section is added to 2009 c 497
6 (uncodified) to read as follows:

7 The office of financial management, in consultation with the fiscal
8 committees of the legislature, may select capital projects that have
9 completed predesign to undergo a budget evaluation study. The budget
10 evaluation study team approach using value engineering techniques must
11 be utilized by the office of financial management in conducting the
12 studies. The office of financial management shall select the budget
13 evaluation team members, contract for the study, and report the results
14 to the legislature and agencies in a timely manner following the study.
15 Funds from the project appropriation must be used by the office of
16 financial management through an interagency agreement with the affected
17 agencies to cover the cost of the study.

18 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7018. FOR THE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC**
19 **INSTRUCTION**

20 The superintendent of public instruction shall work with the
21 department of general administration to help raise school district
22 awareness of the department's services related to standard construction
23 contract language, consultant agreement language, and the consultant
24 selection process. The superintendent of public instruction shall use
25 their web site, or other means, to post access to this information.

26 **Sec. 7019.** RCW 28B.20.725 and 2010 1st sp.s. c 36 s 6008 are each
27 amended to read as follows:

28 The board is hereby empowered:

29 (1) To reserve the right to issue bonds later on a parity with any
30 bonds being issued;

31 (2) To authorize the investing of moneys in the bond retirement
32 fund and any reserve account therein;

33 (3) To authorize the transfer of money from the University of
34 Washington building account to the bond retirement fund when necessary

1 to prevent a default in the payments required to be made out of such
2 fund;

3 (4) To create a reserve account or accounts in the bond retirement
4 fund to secure the payment of the principal of and interest on any
5 bonds;

6 (5) To authorize the transfer to the University of Washington
7 building account of any money on deposit in the bond retirement fund in

20 amended to read as follows:

21 The board is hereby empowered:

22 (1) To reserve the right to issue bonds later on a parity with any
23 bonds being issued;

24 (2) To authorize the investing of moneys in the bond retirement
25 fund and any reserve account therein;

26 (3) To authorize the transfer of money from the Washington State
27 University building account to the bond retirement fund when necessary
28 to prevent a default in the payments required to be made out of such
29 fund;

30 (4) To create a reserve account or accounts in the bond retirement

10 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

11 Within thirty-five days from the date of collection thereof, all
12 building fees at the University of Washington, including building fees
13 to be charged students registering in the schools of medicine and
14 dentistry, shall be paid into the state treasury and credited as
15 follows:

16 One-half or such larger portion as may be necessary to prevent a
17 default in the payments required to be made out of the bond retirement
18 fund to the "University of Washington bond retirement fund" and the
19 remainder thereof to the "University of Washington building account."
20 The sum so credited to the University of Washington building account
21 shall be used exclusively for the purpose of erecting, altering,
22 maintaining, equipping, or furnishing buildings, and for certificates
23 of participation under chapter 39.94 RCW, except for any sums
24 transferred as authorized in RCW 28B.20.725(3). The sum so credited to
25 the University of Washington bond retirement fund shall be used for the
26 payment of principal of and interest on bonds outstanding as provided
27 by chapter 28B.20 RCW except for any sums transferred as authorized in
28 RCW 28B.20.725(5). During the ((2009-2011)) 2011-2013 biennium, sums
29 credited to the University of Washington building account shall also be
30 used for routine facility maintenance and utility costs.

31 **Sec. 7022.** RCW 28B.15.310 and 2009 c 499 s 2 and 2009 c 497 s 6020
32 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

33 Within thirty-five days from the date of collection thereof, all
34 building fees shall be paid and credited as follows: To the Washington
35 State University bond retirement fund, one-half or such larger portion

1 as may be necessary to prevent a default in the payments required to be
2 made out of such bond retirement fund; and the remainder thereof to the
3 Washington State University building account.

4 The sum so credited to the Washington State University building
5 account shall be expended by the board of regents for buildings,
6 equipment, or maintenance on the campus of Washington State University
7 as may be deemed most advisable and for the best interests of the
8 university, and for certificates of participation under chapter 39.94
9 RCW, except for any sums transferred as authorized by law. During the
10 ((2009-2011)) 2011-2013 biennium, sums credited to the Washington State
11 University building account shall also be used for routine facility
12 maintenance and utility costs. Expenditures so made shall be accounted
13 for in accordance with existing law and shall not be expended until
14 appropriated by the legislature.

15 The sum so credited to the Washington State University bond
16 retirement fund shall be used to pay and secure the payment of the
17 principal of and interest on building bonds issued by the university,
18 except for any sums which may be transferred out of such fund as
19 authorized by law.

20 **Sec. 7023.** RCW 28B.35.370 and 2009 c 499 s 5 and 2009 c 497 s 6021
21 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

22 Within thirty-five days from the date of collection thereof all
23 building fees of each regional university and The Evergreen State
24 College shall be paid into the state treasury and these together with
25 such normal school fund revenues as provided in RCW 28B.35.751 as are
26 received by the state treasury shall be credited as follows:

27 (1) On or before June 30th of each year the board of trustees of
28 each regional university and The Evergreen State College, if issuing
29 bonds payable out of its building fees and above described normal
30 school fund revenues, shall certify to the state treasurer the amounts
31 required in the ensuing twelve months to pay and secure the payment of
32 the principal of and interest on such bonds. The amounts so certified
33 by each regional university and The Evergreen State College shall be a

8 in any twelve month period it shall appear that the amount certified by
9 any such board of trustees is insufficient to pay and secure the
10 payment of the principal of and interest on the outstanding building
11 and above described normal school fund revenue bonds of its
12 institution, the state treasurer shall notify the board of trustees and
13 such board shall adjust its certificate so that all requirements of
14 moneys to pay and secure the payment of the principal of and interest
15 on all such bonds then outstanding shall be fully met at all times.

16 (2) All normal school fund revenue pursuant to RCW 28B.35.751 shall
17 be deposited in the Eastern Washington University capital projects
18 account, the Central Washington University capital projects account,
19 the Western Washington University capital projects account, or The
20 Evergreen State College capital projects account respectively, which
21 accounts are hereby created in the state treasury. The sums deposited
22 in the respective capital projects accounts shall be appropriated and
23 expended to pay and secure the payment of the principal of and interest

32 (3) Funds available in the respective capital projects accounts may
33 also be used for certificates of participation under chapter 39.94 RCW.

34 **Sec. 7024.** RCW 28B.50.360 and 2009 c 499 s 6 are each amended to
35 read as follows:

36 Within thirty-five days from the date of start of each quarter all

1 collected building fees of each such community and technical college
2 shall be paid into the state treasury, and shall be credited as
3 follows:

4 (1) On or before June 30th of each year the college board if
5 issuing bonds payable out of building fees shall certify to the state
6 treasurer the amounts required in the ensuing twelve-month period to
7 pay and secure the payment of the principal of and interest on such
8 bonds. The state treasurer shall thereupon deposit the amounts so

29 community and technical colleges in the name of the state of
30 Washington, and the acquisition of sites, rights-of-way, easements,
31 improvements or appurtenances in relation thereto, engineering and

33 administration, and for the payment of principal of and interest on any
34 bonds issued for such purposes. During the 2011-2013 biennium, sums in
35 the capital projects account shall also be used for routine facility
36 maintenance and utility costs.

37 (3) Funds available in the community and technical college capital

1 projects account may also be used for certificates of participation
2 under chapter 39.94 RCW.

3 **Sec. 7025.** RCW 43.43.944 and 2010 1st sp.s. c 37 s 923 are each
4 amended to read as follows:

5 (1) The fire service training account is hereby established in the
6 state treasury. The fund shall consist of:

7 (a) All fees received by the Washington state patrol for fire
8 service training;

9 (b) All grants and bequests accepted by the Washington state patrol
10 under RCW 43.43.940;

11 (c) Twenty percent of all moneys received by the state on fire
12 insurance premiums; and

13 (d) General fund--state moneys appropriated into the account by the
14 legislature.

15 (2) Moneys in the account may be appropriated only for fire service
16 training. The state patrol may use amounts appropriated from the fire
17 service training account under this section to contract with the
18 Washington state firefighters apprenticeship trust for the operation of
19 the firefighter joint apprenticeship training program. The contract
20 may call for payments on a monthly basis. During the 2009-2011 fiscal
21 biennium, the legislature may appropriate funds from this account for
22 school fire prevention activities within the Washington state patrol
23 and for repairs of the burn building. During the 2011-2013 fiscal
24 biennium, the legislature may appropriate funds from this account for
25 school fire prevention activities within the Washington state patrol,
26 and for predesign and repairs of the burn building.

27 (3) Any general fund--state moneys appropriated into the account
28 shall be allocated solely to the firefighter joint apprenticeship
29 training program. The Washington state patrol may contract with
30 outside entities for the administration and delivery of the firefighter
31 joint apprenticeship training program.

32 **Sec. 7026.** RCW 43.63A.125 and 2008 c 327 s 15 are each amended to
33 read as follows:

34 (1) The department shall establish the building communities fund
35 program. Under the program, capital and technical assistance grants
36 may be made to nonprofit organizations for acquiring, constructing, or

1 rehabilitating facilities used for the delivery of nonresidential
2 community services, including social service centers and multipurpose
3 community centers, including those serving a distinct or ethnic
4 population. Such facilities must be located in a distressed community
5 or serve a substantial number of low-income or disadvantaged persons.

6 (2) The department shall establish a competitive process to solicit
7 (~~and~~), evaluate, and rank applications for the building communities
8 fund program as follows:

9 (a) The department shall conduct a statewide solicitation of
10 project applications from nonprofit organizations.

11 (b) The department shall evaluate and rank applications in
12 consultation with a citizen advisory committee using objective
13 criteria. To be considered qualified, applicants must demonstrate that
14 the proposed project:

15 (i) Will increase the range, efficiency, or quality of the services
16 provided to citizens;

17 (ii) Will be located in a distressed community or will serve a
18 substantial number of low-income or disadvantaged persons;

19 (iii) Will offer three or more distinct activities that meet a
20 single community service objective or offer a diverse set of activities
21 that meet multiple community service objectives, including but not
22 limited to: Providing social services; expanding employment
23 opportunities for or increasing the employability of community
24 residents; or offering educational or recreational opportunities
25 separate from the public school system or private schools, as long as
26 recreation is not the sole purpose of the facility;

27 (iv) Reflects a long-term vision for the development of the
28 community, shared by residents, businesses, leaders, and partners;

29 (v) Requires state funding to accomplish a discrete, usable phase
30 of the project;

31 (vi) Is ready to proceed and will make timely use of the funds;

32 (vii) Is sponsored by one or more entities that have the
33 organizational and financial capacity to fulfill the terms of the grant
34 agreement and to maintain the project into the future;

35 (viii) Fills an unmet need for community services;

36 (ix) Will achieve its stated objectives; and

37 (x) Is a community priority as shown through tangible commitments

1 of existing or future assets made to the project by community
2 residents, leaders, businesses, and government partners.

3 (c) The evaluation and ranking process shall also include an
4 examination of existing assets that applicants may apply to projects.
5 Grant assistance under this section shall not exceed twenty-five
6 percent of the total cost of the project, except, under exceptional
7 circumstances, the department may reduce the amount of nonstate match
8 required. No more than ten percent of the total granted amount may be
9 awarded to qualified eligible projects that meet the definition of
10 exceptional circumstances defined in this subsection. For purposes of
11 this subsection, exceptional circumstances include but are not limited
12 to: Natural disasters affecting projects; emergencies beyond an
13 applicant's control, such as a fire or an unanticipated loss of a lease
14 where services are currently provided; or a delay that could result in
15 a threat to public health or safety. The nonstate portion of the total
16 project cost may include cash, the value of real property when acquired
17 solely for the purpose of the project, and in-kind contributions.

18 (d) The department may not set a monetary limit to funding
19 requests.

20 (3) The department shall submit (~~annually~~) biennially to the
21 governor and the legislature in the department's capital budget request
22 (~~an unranked~~) a ranked list of the qualified eligible projects for
23 which applications were received. The list must include a description
24 of each project, its total cost, and the amount of state funding
25 requested. The appropriate fiscal committees of the legislature shall
26 use this list to determine building communities fund projects that may
27 receive funding in the capital budget. The total amount of state
28 capital funding available for all projects on the (~~annual~~) biennial
29 list shall be determined by the capital budget beginning with the 2009-
30 2011 biennium and thereafter. In addition, if cash funds have been
31 appropriated, up to three million dollars may be used for technical
32 assistance grants. The department shall not sign contracts or
33 otherwise financially obligate funds under this section until the
34 legislature has approved a specific list of projects.

35 (4) In addition to the list of ranked qualified eligible projects,
36 the department shall submit to the appropriate fiscal committees of the
37 legislature a summary report that describes the solicitation and

1 evaluation processes, including but not limited to the number of
2 applications received, the total amount of funding requested, issues
3 encountered, if any, and any recommendations for process improvements.

4 (5) After the legislature has approved a specific list of projects
5 in law, the department shall develop and manage appropriate contracts
6 with the selected applicants; monitor project expenditures and grantee
7 performance; report project and contract information; and exercise due
8 diligence and other contract management responsibilities as required.

9 (6) In contracts for grants authorized under this section the
10 department shall include provisions which require that capital
11 improvements shall be held by the grantee for a specified period of
12 time appropriate to the amount of the grant and that facilities shall
13 be used for the express purpose of the grant. If the grantee is found
14 to be out of compliance with provisions of the contract, the grantee
15 shall repay to the state general fund the principal amount of the grant
16 plus interest calculated at the rate of interest on state of Washington
17 general obligation bonds issued most closely to the date of
18 authorization of the grant.

19 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7027. FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF GENERAL**
20 **ADMINISTRATION**

21 The department of general administration shall provide the office
22 of the superintendent of public instruction with existing standard
23 construction contract and consultant agreement standardized language
24 and selection process, for publication on office of the superintendent
25 of public instruction's web site, which can be used at no charge by
26 school districts. In addition, the department of general
27 administration shall provide an option to school districts to modify
28 existing standard construction contract or consultant agreement
29 language and assist districts with the consultant selection process an

33 Eastern Washington University is authorized to sell its center at
34 701 West First Avenue in downtown Spokane, and directed to deposit the
35 proceeds of the sale into the Eastern Washington University capital
36 projects account. The university shall report to the office of

1 financial management and to the appropriate committees of the
2 legislature upon the sale of the downtown center and completion of the
3 updated appraisal.

4 **Sec. 7029.** RCW 43.155.050 and 2010 1st sp.s. c 37 s 932 are each
5 amended to read as follows:

6 The public works assistance account is hereby established in the
7 state treasury. Money may be placed in the public works assistance
8 account from the proceeds of bonds when authorized by the legislature
9 or from any other lawful source. Money in the public works assistance
10 account shall be used to make loans and to give financial guarantees to
11 local governments for public works projects. Moneys in the account may
12 also be appropriated to provide for state match requirements under
13 federal law for projects and activities conducted and financed by the
14 board under the drinking water assistance account. Not more than
15 fifteen percent of the biennial capital budget appropriation to the
16 public works board from this account may be expended or obligated for
17 preconstruction loans, emergency loans, or loans for capital facility
18 planning under this chapter; of this amount, not more than ten percent
19 of the biennial capital budget appropriation may be expended for
20 emergency loans and not more than one percent of the biennial capital
21 budget appropriation may be expended for capital facility planning
22 loans. For the 2007-2009 biennium, moneys in the account may be used
23 for grants for projects identified in section 138, chapter 488, Laws of
24 2005 and section 1033, chapter 520, Laws of 2007. During the 2009-2011
25 fiscal biennium, sums in the public works assistance account may be
26 used for the water pollution control revolving fund program match in
27 section 3013, chapter 36, Laws of 2010 1st sp. sess. During the 2009-
28 2011 fiscal biennium, the legislature may transfer from the job
29 development fund to the general fund such amounts as reflect the excess
30 fund balance of the fund. During the 2011-2013 fiscal biennium, sums
31 in the public works assistance account may be used for grants for
32 public works projects funded under section 2006 of this act.

33 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7030. SALARY ADJUSTMENT**

34 The appropriations in this act shall be expended solely for the
35 purposes designated in this act and are subject to the following
36 conditions and limitations:

1 (1) Appropriations in this act are provided solely for a 3.0
2 percent salary reduction effective July 1, 2011, through June 29, 2013,
3 for all employees of the executive, legislative, and judicial branches,
4 including those employees in the Washington management service, and
5 including employees exempt from merit system rules, except for:

6 (a) Elected officials whose salaries are set by the commission on
7 salaries for elected officials;

8 (b) Student employees at state institutions of higher education;

9 (c) Faculty employees at state institutions of higher education:
10 PROVIDED, HOWEVER, That appropriations to higher education institutions
11 are reduced in an amount reflecting a 3.0 percent reduction in faculty
12 salary expenditures;

13 (d) Certificated employees of the state school for the blind and
14 the center for childhood deafness and hearing loss;

15 (e) Commissioned officers of the Washington state patrol
16 represented by the state patrol troopers' association and the
17 Washington state patrol lieutenants' association;

18 (f) Represented ferry workers of the Washington state department of
19 transportation, provided, however, that other reductions are included
20 in section 504 of the 2011-2013 transportation appropriations act;

21 (g) Employees whose salary is less than \$2,500 per month; and

22 (h) Employees as specified in subsection (2) of this section.

23 (2) For employees subject to the 3.0 percent reduction in salary
24 under subsection (1) of this section employees will receive temporary
25 salary reduction leave of up to 5.2 hours per month. The director of
26 personnel shall adopt rules governing the accrual and use of temporary
27 salary reduction leave.

28 (3) The department of retirement systems shall include any forgone
29 salary or lost work hours under subsections (1) and (3) of this section
30 in the final average compensation of employees affected for purposes of
31 calculating retirement benefits, as specified in executive request
32 legislation Z-0211.1/11.

33 (4) The appropriation from dedicated funds and accounts shall be
34 made in the amounts specified and from the dedicated funds and accounts
35 specified in office of financial management document 2011-01, which is
36 hereby incorporated by reference. The office of financial management
37 shall allocate the moneys appropriated in this section in the amounts

1 specified and to the state agencies specified in office of financial
2 management document 2011-01 and adjust appropriation schedules
3 accordingly.

4 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7031.** If any provision of this act or its
5 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the
6 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other
7 persons or circumstances is not affected.

8 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7032.** Section 7005 of this act expires June 30,
9 2013.

10 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7033.** Section 7029 of this act takes effect
11 June 30, 2011.

12 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7034.** This act is necessary for the immediate
13 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
14 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect
15 immediately, except for sections 7021 through 7024 and 7026 of this act
16 which take effect July 1, 2011.
