1 AN ACT Relating to regulating the use of off-road vehicles in
2 certain areas; amending RCW 46.09.360, 46.17.200, 46.17.350,
3 46.16A.080, 79A.80.010, 46.09.490, and 46.37.010; reenacting and
4 amending RCW 46.09.470, 46.63.020, and 43.84.092; adding a new section
5 to chapter 46.04 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 46.61 RCW; adding
6 a new section to chapter 46.09 RCW; adding a new section to chapter
7 46.68 RCW; prescribing penalties; and providing an effective date.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

9 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 46.04 RCW
10 to read as follows:

11 "Four-wheel all-terrain vehicle" means any motorized nonhighway
12 vehicle with handlebars that is fifty inches or less in width, has a
13 seat height of at least twenty inches, weighs less than one thousand
14 five hundred pounds, and has tires having a diameter of thirty inches
15 or less.

16 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 46.61 RCW
17 to read as follows:

18 (1) A person may operate a four-wheel all-terrain vehicle as

1 defined in section 1 of this act upon any roadway of this state having
2 a speed limit of thirty-five miles per hour or less subject to the
3 following restrictions and requirements:

4 (a) A person may not operate a four-wheel all-terrain vehicle upon
5 state highways that are listed in chapter 47.17 RCW; however, a person
6 may operate a four-wheel all-terrain vehicle upon a segment of a state
7 highway listed in chapter 47.17 RCW if the segment is within the limits
8 of a city and the speed limit on the segment is thirty-five miles per
9 hour or less;

10 (b) A person may not operate a four-wheel all-terrain vehicle upon
11 a roadway of this state without first having obtained and having in
12 full force and effect a current and proper vehicle registration, and a
13 license plate in compliance with chapter 46.16A RCW. The license plate
14 must be displayed in compliance with chapter 46.16A RCW. A four-wheel
15 all-terrain vehicle may not be registered for commercial use;

16 (c) A person may not operate a four-wheel all-terrain vehicle upon
17 a roadway of this state without (i) first obtaining a valid driver's
18 license issued to Washington residents in compliance with chapter 46.20
19 RCW, or (ii) possessing a valid driver's license issued by the state of
20 the person's residence if the person is a nonresident;

21 (d) A person may not operate a four-wheel all-terrain vehicle
22 subject to registration under chapter 46.16A RCW on a roadway of this
23 state unless the person is insured under a motor vehicle liability
24 policy in compliance with chapter 46.30 RCW;

25 (e) A person operating a four-wheel all-terrain vehicle may not
26 cross a roadway with a speed limit in excess of thirty-five miles per
27 hour, unless the crossing begins and ends on a roadway, or an ORV trail
28 as defined in RCW 46.09.310, with a speed limit of thirty-five miles
29 per hour or less and occurs at an intersection of approximately ninety
30 degrees, except that the operator of a four-wheel all-terrain vehicle
31 may not cross at an uncontrolled intersection of a public highway
32 listed under chapter 47.17 RCW; and

33 (f)(i) A person may not operate a four-wheel all-terrain vehicle on
34 the roadways within the boundaries of a city with a population of
35 fifteen thousand or more unless the city by ordinance has approved the
36 operation of four-wheel all-terrain vehicles on city roadways.

37 (ii) The legislative body of a city with a population of less than

1 fifteen thousand may, by ordinance, designate a road or highway within
2 its boundaries to be unsuitable for use by four-wheel all-terrain
3 vehicles.

4 (iii) Any roadways authorized by a legislative body of a city under
5 (f)(i) of this subsection or designated as unsuitable under (f)(ii) of
6 this subsection must be listed publicly and made accessible from the
7 main page of the city web site.

8 (2) A person who operates a four-wheel all-terrain vehicle under
9 this section must pay the annual vehicle license fee required in RCW
10 46.17.350(1)(e) for the four-wheel all-terrain vehicle.

11 (3) Any four-wheel all-terrain vehicle operated under this section
12 must have:

13 (a) Headlights meeting the requirements of RCW 46.37.030 and
14 46.37.040 and used at all times when the vehicle is in motion upon a
15 highway;

16 (b) Tail lamps meeting the requirements of RCW 46.37.050 and used
17 at all times when the vehicle is in motion upon a highway;

18 (c) A stop lamp meeting the requirements of RCW 46.37.200;

19 (d) Reflectors meeting the requirements of RCW 46.37.060;

20 (e) Turn signals meeting the requirements of RCW 46.37.200;

21 (f) A mirror on both the left and right handlebar which must be
22 located to give the operator a complete view of the highway for a
23 distance of at least two hundred feet to the rear of the vehicle;

24 (g) A windshield, unless the operator wears glasses, goggles, or a
25 face shield while operating the vehicle, of a type conforming to rules
26 adopted by the Washington state patrol;

27 (h) A horn or warning device meeting the requirements of RCW
28 46.37.380;

29 (i) Brakes in working order;

30 (j) A spark arrester and muffling device meeting the requirements
31 of RCW 46.09.470; and

32 (k) Fenders adequate for minimizing the spray or splash of water,
33 rocks, or mud from the roadway. Fenders must be as wide as the tires
34 behind which they are mounted and extend downward at least half way to
35 the center of the axle.

36 (4) A person must certify under oath, on a form provided by the
37 department, that the equipment listed in subsection (3) of this section
38 has been installed on the four-wheel all-terrain vehicle and that the

1 equipment is operable. A person who makes a false statement regarding
2 the installation of the equipment listed in subsection (3) of this
3 section is guilty of false swearing, a gross misdemeanor, under RCW
4 9A.72.040.

5 (5) Every person operating a four-wheel all-terrain vehicle under
6 this section is granted all rights and is subject to all duties
7 applicable to the operator of a motorcycle under RCW 46.37.530 and
8 chapter 46.61 RCW, except that four-wheel all-terrain vehicles may not
9 be operated side-by-side in a single lane of traffic. Four-wheel all-
10 terrain vehicles are subject to chapter 46.55 RCW.

11 (6) Any person who violates this section commits a traffic
12 infraction.

13 (7) Accidents must be recorded and tracked in compliance with
14 chapter 46.52 RCW. An accident report must indicate and be tracked
15 separately when any of the vehicles involved are a four-wheel all-
16 terrain vehicle.

17 (8) Local authorities may not establish requirements for the
18 registration of four-wheel all-terrain vehicles.

19 **Sec. 3.** RCW 46.09.360 and 2006 c 212 s 4 are each amended to read
20 as follows:

21 (1) Notwithstanding any of the provisions of this chapter, any
22 city, county, or other political subdivision of this state, or any
23 state agency, may regulate the operation of nonhighway vehicles on
24 public lands, waters, and other properties under its jurisdiction, and
25 on streets, roads, or highways within its boundaries as outlined in
26 this section, by adopting regulations or ordinances of its governing
27 body, provided such regulations are not less stringent than the
28 provisions of this chapter. However, the legislative body of a:

29 (a) City with a population of (~~less~~) fewer than three thousand
30 persons, or of a county with a population of no more than five thousand
31 persons, may, by ordinance, designate a street, road, or highway within
32 its boundaries to be suitable for use by off-road vehicles(~~(. — The~~
33 ~~legislative body of a))~~; and

34 (b) County with a population of more than five thousand persons
35 may, by ordinance, designate a road or highway within its boundaries to
36 be suitable for use by off-road vehicles if the road or highway is a

1 direct connection between a city with a population of (~~less~~) fewer
2 than three thousand persons and an off-road vehicle recreation
3 facility.

4 (2) For purposes of subsection (1)(a) and (b) of this section,
5 "off-road vehicles" does not include four-wheel all-terrain vehicles as
6 defined in section 1 of this act.

7 **Sec. 4.** RCW 46.17.200 and 2011 c 171 s 56 are each amended to read
8 as follows:

9 (1) In addition to all other fees and taxes required by law, the
10 department, county auditor or other agent, or subagent appointed by the
11 director shall charge:

12 (a) The following license plate fees for each license plate, unless
13 the owner or type of vehicle is exempt from payment:

20 (b) A license plate retention fee, as required under RCW
21 46.16A.200(10)(~~(a)(iii)~~) (c), of twenty dollars if the owner wishes
22 to retain the current license plate number upon license plate
23 replacement, unless the owner or type of vehicle is exempt from
24 payment. The twenty dollar fee must be deposited in the multimodal
25 transportation account created in RCW 47.66.070.

26 (c) A ten dollar license plate transfer fee, as required under RCW
27 46.16A.200(8)(a), when transferring standard issue license plates from
28 one vehicle to another, unless the owner or type of vehicle is exempt
29 from payment. The ten dollar license plate transfer fee must be
30 deposited in the motor vehicle fund created in RCW 46.68.070.

31 (d) Former prisoner of war license plates, as described in RCW
32 46.18.235, may be transferred to a replacement vehicle upon payment of
33 a five dollar license plate fee, in addition to any other fee required
34 by law.

1 (2) The department may, upon request, provide license plates that
 2 have been used and returned to the department to individuals for
 3 nonvehicular use. The department may charge a fee of up to five
 4 dollars per license plate to cover costs or recovery for postage and
 5 handling. The department may waive the fee for license plates used in
 6 educational projects and may, by rule, provide standards for the fee
 7 waiver and restrictions on the number of license plates provided to any
 8 one person. The fee must be deposited in the motor vehicle fund
 9 created in RCW 46.68.070.

10 **Sec. 5.** RCW 46.17.350 and 2010 c 161 s 531 are each amended to
 11 read as follows:

12 (1) Before accepting an application for a vehicle registration, the
 13 department, county auditor or other agent, or subagent appointed by the
 14 director shall require the applicant, unless specifically exempt, to
 15 pay the following vehicle license fee by vehicle type:

5 (2) The vehicle license fee required in subsection (1) of this
6 section is in addition to the filing fee required under RCW 46.17.005,
7 and any other fee or tax required by law.

8 **Sec. 6.** RCW 46.16A.080 and 2011 c 171 s 45 are each amended to
9 read as follows:

10 The following vehicles are not required to be registered under this
11 chapter:

12 (1) Converter gears used to convert a semitrailer into a trailer or
13 a two-axle truck or tractor into a three or more axle truck or tractor
14 or used in any other manner to increase the number of axles of a
15 vehicle;

16 (2) Electric-assisted bicycles;

17 (3)(a) Farm implements, tractors, trailers, and other farm vehicles
18 (i) operated within a radius of fifteen miles of the farm where it is
19 principally used or garaged, including trailers designed as cook or
20 bunk houses, (ii) used exclusively for animal herding, and (iii)
21 temporarily operating or drawn upon the public highways, and (b)
22 trailers used exclusively to transport farm implements from one farm to
23 another during daylight hours or at night when the trailer is equipped
24 with lights that comply with applicable law;

25 (4) Forklifts operated during daylight hours on public highways
26 adjacent to and within five hundred feet of the warehouses they serve;

27 (5) Golf carts, as defined in RCW 46.04.1945, operating within a
28 designated golf cart zone as described in RCW 46.08.175;

29 (6) Motor vehicles operated solely within a national recreation
30 area that is not accessible by a state highway, including motorcycles,
31 motor homes, passenger cars, and sport utility vehicles. This
32 exemption applies only after initial registration;

33 (7) Motorized foot scooters;

34 (8) Nurse rigs or equipment auxiliary for the use of and designed
35 or modified for the fueling, repairing, or loading of spray and

1 fertilizer applicator rigs and not used, designed, or modified
2 primarily for the purpose of transportation;

3 (9) Off-road vehicles operated on a street, road, or highway as
4 authorized under RCW 46.09.360, or nonhighway roads under RCW
5 46.09.450. For purposes of this subsection "off-road vehicles" does
6 not include four-wheel all-terrain vehicles registered for use under
7 section 2 of this act;

8 (10) Special highway construction equipment;

9 (11) Dump trucks and tractor-dump trailer combinations that are:

10 (a) Designed and used primarily for construction work on highways;

11 (b) Not designed or used primarily for the transportation of
12 persons or property on a public highway; and

13 (c) Only incidentally operated or moved over the highways;

14 (12) Spray or fertilizer applicator rigs designed and used
15 exclusively for spraying or fertilization in the conduct of
16 agricultural operations and not primarily for the purpose of
17 transportation;

18 (13) Tow dollies;

19 (14) Trams used for transporting persons to and from facilities
20 related to the horse racing industry as regulated in chapter 67.16 RCW,
21 as long as the public right-of-way routes over which the trams operate
22 are not more than one mile from end to end, the public rights-of-way
23 over which the tram operates have average daily traffic of not more
24 than fifteen thousand vehicles per day, and the activity is in
25 conformity with federal law. The operator must be a licensed driver
26 and at least eighteen years old. For the purposes of this section,
27 "tram" also means a vehicle, or combination of vehicles linked together
28 with a single mode of propulsion, used to transport persons from one
29 location to another; and

30 (15) Vehicles used by the state parks and recreation commission
31 exclusively for park maintenance and operations upon public highways
32 within state parks.

33 **Sec. 7.** RCW 79A.80.010 and 2011 c 320 s 2 are each amended to read
34 as follows:

35 The definitions in this section apply throughout this chapter
36 unless the context clearly requires otherwise.

1 (1) "Agency" or "agencies" means the department of fish and
2 wildlife, the department of natural resources, and the parks and
3 recreation commission.

4 (2) "Annual natural investment permit" means the annual permit
5 issued by the parks and recreation commission for the purpose of
6 launching boats from the designated state parks boat launch sites.

7 (3) "Camper registration" means proof of payment of a camping fee
8 on recreational lands managed by the parks and recreation commission.

9 (4) "Day-use permit" means the permit created in RCW 79A.80.030.

10 (5) "Discover pass" means the annual pass created in RCW
11 79A.80.020.

12 (6) "Motor vehicle" has the same meaning as defined in RCW
13 46.04.320 and which are required to be registered under chapter 46.16A
14 RCW. "Motor vehicle" does not include those motor vehicles exempt from
15 registration under RCW 46.16A.080, four-wheel all-terrain vehicles
16 registered for use under section 2 of this act, and state and publicly
17 owned motor vehicles as provided in RCW 46.16A.170.

18 (7) "Recreation site or lands" means a state park or fish and
19 wildlife conservation sites including water access areas, boat ramps,
20 wildlife areas, parking areas, roads, and trailheads, or department of
21 natural resources developed or designated recreation areas, sites,
22 trailheads, and parking areas.

23 (8) "Sno-park seasonal permit" means the seasonal permit issued by
24 the parks and recreation commission for providing access to winter
25 recreational facilities for the period of November 1st through March
26 31st.

27 (9) "Vehicle access pass" means the pass created in RCW 79A.80.040.

28 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8.** A new section is added to chapter 46.09 RCW
29 to read as follows:

30 (1) A person may not operate a nonhighway vehicle on public lands
31 unless the area is designated by the land manager as open for
32 nonhighway vehicle use.

33 (2) A violation of this section is a misdemeanor with a penalty of
34 five hundred dollars.

35 **Sec. 9.** RCW 46.09.470 and 2011 c 171 s 28 and 2011 c 121 s 4 are
36 each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

1 (1) Except as provided in subsection (4) of this section, it is a
2 traffic infraction for any person to operate any nonhighway vehicle:

3 (a) In such a manner as to endanger the property of another;

4 (b) On lands not owned by the operator or owner of the nonhighway
5 vehicle without a lighted headlight and taillight between the hours of
6 dusk and dawn, or when otherwise required for the safety of others
7 regardless of ownership;

8 (c) On lands not owned by the operator or owner of the nonhighway
9 vehicle without an adequate braking device or when otherwise required
10 for the safety of others regardless of ownership;

11 (d) Without a spark arrester approved by the department of natural
12 resources;

13 (e) Without an adequate, and operating, muffling device which
14 effectively limits vehicle noise to no more than eighty-six decibels on
15 the "A" scale at fifty feet as measured by the Society of Automotive
16 Engineers (SAE) test procedure J 331a, except that a maximum noise
17 level of one hundred and five decibels on the "A" scale at a distance
18 of twenty inches from the exhaust outlet shall be an acceptable
19 substitute in lieu of the Society of Automotive Engineers test
20 procedure J 331a when measured:

21 (i) At a forty-five degree angle at a distance of twenty inches
22 from the exhaust outlet;

23 (ii) With the vehicle stationary and the engine running at a steady
24 speed equal to one-half of the manufacturer's maximum allowable ("red
25 line") engine speed or where the manufacturer's maximum allowable
26 engine speed is not known the test speed in revolutions per minute
27 calculated as sixty percent of the speed at which maximum horsepower is
28 developed; and

29 (iii) With the microphone placed ten inches from the side of the
30 vehicle, one-half way between the lowest part of the vehicle body and
31 the ground plane, and in the same lateral plane as the rearmost exhaust
32 outlet where the outlet of the exhaust pipe is under the vehicle;

33 (f) On lands not owned by the operator or owner of the nonhighway
34 vehicle upon the shoulder or inside bank or slope of any nonhighway
35 road or highway, or upon the median of any divided highway;

36 (g) On lands not owned by the operator or owner of the nonhighway
37 vehicle in any area or in such a manner so as to unreasonably expose

1 the underlying soil, or to create an erosion condition, or to injure,
2 damage, or destroy trees, growing crops, or other vegetation;

3 (h) On lands not owned by the operator or owner of the nonhighway
4 vehicle or on any nonhighway road or trail, when these are restricted
5 to pedestrian or animal travel; and

6 ~~((On any public lands in violation of rules and regulations of
7 the agency administering such lands; and~~

8 ~~(+j))~~ On a private nonhighway road in violation of RCW
9 46.09.450(3).

10 (2) It is a misdemeanor for any person to operate any nonhighway
11 vehicle while under the influence of intoxicating liquor or a
12 controlled substance.

13 (3)(a) Except for an off-road vehicle equipped with seat belts and
14 roll bars or an enclosed passenger compartment, it is a traffic
15 infraction for any person to operate or ride an off-road vehicle on a
16 nonhighway road without wearing upon his or her head a motorcycle
17 helmet fastened securely while in motion. For purposes of this
18 section, "motorcycle helmet" has the same meaning as provided in RCW
19 46.37.530.

20 (b) Subsection (3)(a) of this section does not apply to an off-road
21 vehicle operator operating on his or her own land.

22 (c) Subsection (3)(a) of this section does not apply to an off-road
23 vehicle operator operating on agricultural lands owned or leased by the
24 off-road vehicle operator or the operator's employer.

25 (4) It is not a traffic infraction to operate an off-road vehicle
26 on a street, road, or highway as authorized under RCW 46.09.360 ~~((or))~~,
27 46.61.705, or section 2 of this act.

28 **Sec. 10.** RCW 46.09.490 and 2011 c 171 s 29 are each amended to
29 read as follows:

30 (1) Except as provided in RCW 46.09.470(2) ~~((and))~~, 46.09.480, and
31 section 8 of this act as now or hereafter amended, violation of the
32 provisions of this chapter is a traffic infraction for which a penalty
33 of not less than twenty-five dollars may be imposed.

34 (2) In addition to the penalties provided in subsection (1) of this
35 section, the owner and/or the operator of any nonhighway vehicle shall
36 be liable for any damage to property including damage to trees, shrubs,

1 or growing crops injured as the result of travel by the nonhighway
2 vehicle. The owner of such property may recover from the person
3 responsible three times the amount of damage.

4 **Sec. 11.** RCW 46.63.020 and 2010 c 252 s 3, 2010 c 161 s 1125, and
5 2010 c 8 s 9077 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

6 Failure to perform any act required or the performance of any act
7 prohibited by this title or an equivalent administrative regulation or
8 local law, ordinance, regulation, or resolution relating to traffic
9 including parking, standing, stopping, and pedestrian offenses, is
10 designated as a traffic infraction and may not be classified as a
11 criminal offense, except for an offense contained in the following
12 provisions of this title or a violation of an equivalent administrative
13 regulation or local law, ordinance, regulation, or resolution:

14 (1) RCW 46.09.470(2) relating to the operation of a nonhighway
15 vehicle while under the influence of intoxicating liquor or a
16 controlled substance;

17 (2) RCW 46.09.480 relating to operation of nonhighway vehicles;

18 (3) Section 8 of this act relating to the operation of nonhighway
19 vehicles on public lands;

20 (4) RCW 46.10.490(2) relating to the operation of a snowmobile
21 while under the influence of intoxicating liquor or narcotics or habit-
22 forming drugs or in a manner endangering the person of another;

23 ((+4)) (5) RCW 46.10.495 relating to the operation of snowmobiles;

24 ((+5)) (6) Chapter 46.12 RCW relating to certificates of title,
25 registration certificates, and markings indicating that a vehicle has
26 been destroyed or declared a total loss;

27 ((+6)) (7) RCW 46.16A.030 and 46.16A.050(3) relating to the
28 nonpayment of taxes and fees by failure to register a vehicle and
29 falsifying residency when registering a motor vehicle;

30 ((+7)) (8) RCW 46.16A.520 relating to permitting unauthorized
31 persons to drive;

32 ((+8)) (9) RCW 46.16A.320 relating to vehicle trip permits;

33 ((+9)) (10) RCW 46.19.050 relating to knowingly providing false
34 information in conjunction with an application for a special placard or
35 license plate for disabled persons' parking;

36 ((+10)) (11) RCW 46.20.005 relating to driving without a valid
37 driver's license;

1 (~~(11)~~) (12) RCW 46.20.091 relating to false statements regarding
2 a driver's license or instruction permit;

4 and use of a driver's license;
