- 1 AN ACT Relating to inspection of dairy cattle; amending RCW
- 2 16.57.160; and repealing RCW 16.57.303.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 16.57.160 and 2011 c 204 s 13 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- 6 (1) The director may adopt rules:
- 7 (a) Designating any point for mandatory inspection of cattle or 8 horses or the furnishing of proof that cattle or horses passing or 9 being transported through the point have been inspected or identified and are lawfully being transported;
- 11 (b) Providing for issuance of individual horse and cattle 12 identification certificates or other means of horse and cattle 13 identification;
- (c) Designating the documents that constitute other satisfactory proof of ownership for cattle and horses. A bill of sale may not be designated as documenting satisfactory proof of ownership for cattle; and
- 18 (d) Designating when inspection certificates, certificates of 19 permit, or other transportation documents required by law or rule must

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designate a physical address of a destination. Cattle and horses must be delivered or transported directly to the physical address of that destination.

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- (2) A self-inspection certificate may be accepted as satisfactory proof of ownership for cattle if the director determines that the self-inspection certificate, together with other available documentation, sufficiently establishes ownership. Self-inspection certificates completed after June 10, 2010, are not satisfactory proof of ownership for cattle.
- 10 (3)(a) Upon request by a milk producer licensed under chapter 15.36

 11 RCW, the department must issue a tag to be placed by the producer

 12 before the first point of sale on bull calves and free martins

 13 (infertile female calves) under thirty days of age. The fee for each

 14 tag is the cost to the department for manufacture and purchase of the

 15 tag plus the applicable beef commission assessment. The tag may be

 16 referred to as a "green tag."
 - (b) Transactions involving unbranded dairy breed bull calves or free martins (infertile female calves) not being moved or transported out of Washington are exempt from inspection requirements under this chapter only if:
- 21 <u>(i) The animal is under thirty days old and has not been previously</u>
 22 bought or sold;
- 23 <u>(ii) The seller holds a valid milk producer's license under chapter</u> 24 15.36 RCW;
- 25 <u>(iii) The sale does not take place at or through a public livestock</u> 26 <u>market or special sale authorized by chapter 16.65 RCW; and</u>
- 27 <u>(iv) Each animal is officially identified as provided in (a) of</u> 28 this subsection.
- (c) Under this subsection (3), a certificate of permit and a bill of sale listing each animal's individual official identification must accompany the animal to the buyer's location. These documents do not constitute proof of ownership under this chapter.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. RCW 16.57.303 (Proceeds from sale of impounded dairy breed cattle--Paid to seller) and 2003 c 326 s 37 are each repealed.

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
