- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature finds that patient safety 5 and service are essential components of a successful health care Recognizing the limitations of individual providers and 6 resources, it is not possible for each health care provider to offer every possible service to every patient in a safe and timely manner. 8 9 To that end, there has been a long tradition in all areas of the health 10 care field to utilize a referral process in order to effectively connect a patient with the services he or she needs. In order to 11 facilitate safe, timely, medically appropriate, and efficient patient 12 care, the legislature finds that a standardization of the referral 13 14 process in the pharmacy profession is in the best interests of
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 18.64 RCW to read as follows:

patients, pharmacies, and pharmacists.

18 (1) Pharmacies and pharmacists have a duty to facilitate the

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- delivery of lawfully prescribed and medically appropriate drugs or devices and those approved for restricted distribution by pharmacies, to patients in a timely manner, except under the following circumstances:
 - (a) Prescriptions containing obvious or known errors, inadequacies in the instructions, known contraindications, or incompatible prescriptions;
 - (b) Potentially fraudulent prescriptions; and

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- 9 (c) National or state emergencies or guidelines affecting 10 availability, usage, or supplies of drugs or devices.
 - (2) A pharmacy or pharmacist fulfills the duty to facilitate the delivery of a lawfully prescribed and medically appropriate drug or device if, when presented with a lawful, medically appropriate prescription or request for distribution, a pharmacy or pharmacist:
 - (a) Dispenses or delivers the lawfully prescribed and medically appropriate drug or device or a therapeutically equivalent alternative drug or device;
 - (b) Facilitates the patient's access to the lawfully prescribed and medically appropriate drug or device by referring the patient to a pharmacy or other appropriate health care provider to provide the drug or device. To complete the referral, the referring pharmacy or pharmacist must contact the provider of the patient's choice to confirm that the drug or device is available, and communicate the prescription to the new provider; or
 - (c) Returns the unfilled prescription if the patient or the patient's caregiver objects to a referral.
 - (3) Nothing in this section requires a pharmacy to deliver a drug or device without payment of its usual and customary or contracted charge.
 - (4) A pharmacy or pharmacist may not be disciplined or discriminated against in employment or professional privileges for referring a patient to another provider in lieu of dispensing a drug or device so long as the pharmacy or pharmacist has complied with the requirements of this section.

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
