1            AN ACT Relating to federal receipts reporting requirements; and  
2 adding a new section to chapter 43.88 RCW.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4            NEW SECTION.    **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 43.88 RCW  
5 to read as follows:

6            (1) As used in this section:

7            (a) "Designated state agency" means the department of social and  
8 health services, the department of health, the health care authority,  
9 the department of commerce, the department of ecology, the department  
10 of fish and wildlife, the office of the superintendent of public  
11 instruction, and the department of early learning.

12            (b) "Federal receipts" means the federal financial assistance, as  
13 defined in 31 U.S.C. Sec. 7501 on the effective date of this section,  
14 that is reported as part of a single audit.

15            (c) "Single audit" is as defined in 31 U.S.C. Sec. 7501 on the  
16 effective date of this section.

17            (2) Subject to subsection (3) of this section, a designated state  
18 agency shall prepare as part of the agency's biennial budget submittal  
19 under this chapter a report that:

1 (a) Reports the aggregate value of federal receipts the designated  
2 state agency estimated for the ensuing biennium;  
3 (b) Calculates the percentage of the designated state agency's  
4 total budget for the ensuing biennium that constitutes federal receipts  
5 that the designated state agency received; and  
6 (c) Develops plans for operating the designated state agency if  
7 there is a reduction of:  
8 (i) Five percent or more in the federal receipts that the  
9 designated state agency receives; and  
10 (ii) Twenty-five percent or more in the federal receipts that the  
11 designated state agency receives.  
12 (3) The report required by subsection (2) of this section prepared  
13 by the superintendent of public instruction shall include the  
14 information required by subsection (2)(a) through (c) of this section  
15 for each school district within the state.
