Concerning beer and wine theater licenses.  
(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)  
Creates a beer and wine theater license.

Creating new efficiency standards.  
(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Establishes minimum energy efficiency standards for battery charger systems, battery backup, and uninterruptible power supplies.

Establishes minimum water conservation standards for water closets, urinals, showerheads, and various types of faucets.

Authorizes a city or county to enact an ordinance authorizing the sale and installation of certain plumbing fixtures.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Specifies that records, photographs, digital photographs, microphotographs, videotapes, and other recorded images from traffic safety cameras and toll systems are available for the investigation and prosecution of crimes pursuant to a lawfully issued search warrant.

Changes the property tax levy limit calculation by including the value of solar, biomass, and geothermal facilities.

Concerning disproportionate share hospital adjustments.

**HB 1636** by Representatives Rodne, Cody, Ryu, and Morrell

Concerning interpretation of state law regarding rebating practices by health care entities.

Adds language to chapter 19.68 RCW (rebating by practitioners of healing professions) to ensure that it is interpreted in a manner consistent with the federal antikickback statute, except with respect to arrangements involving an entity which principally operates as a clinical laboratory.

**HB 1637** by Representatives Morrell, Short, Cody, Rodne, Harris, Green, Angel, Jinkins, Moeller, Ryu, Moscoso, and Pollet

Requires contracts with managed care plans to include a requirement that certain medicaid managed care enrollees be placed in a comprehensive medication management process with the primary care provider or state licensed pharmacist.

Addressing insurance, generally.

Makes revisions and updates relating to the authority and means of implementing the insurance code.

**HB 1639** by Representatives Bergquist, Pike, Riccelli,

Carlyle, Walsh, Ryu, and Moscoso; by request of Secretary of State

Adjusting presidential elector compensation.

Changes the subsistence allowance and travel expenses for presidential electors.

**HB 1640** by Representatives Pettigrew, Springer, and Magendanz

Requiring policies regarding assignment of certificated instructional staff.

Requires each school district board of directors of a school district with a year-end average headcount enrollment of ten thousand or more students to adopt a policy on assignment of certificated instructional staff.

**HB 1641** by Representatives Pettigrew, Springer, and Magendanz

Creating a statewide school district for the purpose of improving performance of the most persistently lowest achieving schools.

Establishes the renewal district as a statewide school district within the state to provide a transformation and renewal of school governance, staffing, leadership, and management.

**HB 1642** by Representatives Pettigrew, Springer, Habib, Holy, Ryu, and Magendanz

Establishing policies to support academic acceleration for high school students.

Requires each school district board of directors to adopt an academic acceleration policy for high school students.

Establishes an academic acceleration incentive program to support teacher training, curriculum, technology, examination fees, and other costs associated with implementing the program.

Requires the office of the superintendent of public instruction to collect and post on the Washington state report card web site certain results from the program.

**HB 1643** by Representatives Fey, Short, Uptegrove, Nealey, Pollet, Liias, Ormsby, Ryu, and Moscoso

Regarding energy conservation under the energy independence act.

Requires the utilities and transportation commission or the attorney general, as appropriate, to reduce administrative penalties imposed on a qualifying utility that has not met its biennial energy conservation acquisition target.

**HB 1644** by Representatives Fey, Klippert, Ryu, Clibborn, Rodne, Hargrove, Moscoso, and Pollet

Concerning transportation planning objectives and performance measures for local and regional agencies.

Authorizes a local or regional agency engaging in transportation planning to voluntarily establish objectives and performance measures to demonstrate progress toward the attainment of the state's transportation system's policy goals or any other transportation policy goals established by the local or regional agency.

**HB 1645** by Representatives Riccelli, Sells, Ryu, and Moscoso; by request of Washington State Higher Education Facilities Authority

Increasing the number of public members on the Washington higher education facilities authority.

Changes the composition of the Washington higher education facilities authority.

**HB 1646** by Representatives Stanford, Warnick, Smith, Hunt, Ryu, and Pollet; by request of State Treasurer

Creating a council on state debt.

Creates the council on state debt to advise and make recommendations to the governor and the legislature on prudent levels and types of state debt to fund essential capital and transportation projects.

Requires budget documents to include debt service required to be paid from any fund for bonds, including payment requirements on projects financed by other methods for the full term of the financing.

Requires the state treasurer to: (1) Publish a debt affordability study that provides an assessment of the state's current debt portfolio and an analysis of the impact of future debt issuance; and

(2) Convene and staff a work group to assist with the study.

Requires the governor, to the extent any budget document or documents set forth a proposal to issue debt, to prepare a bond authorization bill that reflects the amount and type of debt proposed to be issued.

Prohibits budget documents from setting forth a proposal that relies on an amount of state debt that exceeds the bond authorization bill.

**HB 1647** by Representatives Tarleton, Haler, Riccelli, Maxwell, Sawyer, Scott, Bergquist, Farrell, Morrell, Jinkins, Roberts, and Pollet

Requiring landlords to maintain and safeguard keys to leased premises.

Requires landlords to maintain and safeguard master keys and duplicate keys to leased premises.

**HB 1648** by Representatives Appleton, Johnson, McCoy, Pike, Ryu, Moscoso, and Hansen

Providing for community economic revitalization in incorporated areas.

Authorizes the community economic revitalization board to make interest-free loans and revitalization loans for purposes of the revitalization of abandoned and vacant properties within incorporated areas of the state.

Creates the revitalization loan program account.

**HB 1649** by Representatives Hudgins, Buys, Upthegrove, Bergquist, Ryu, and Pollet

Concerning autonomous vehicles.

Authorizes a vehicle controlled by autonomous technology to be operated on roads in the state by employees, contractors, or other persons designated by manufacturers of autonomous technology for the purpose of testing the technology.

**HB 1650** by Representatives McCoy, Haler, Orcutt, Moscoso, Hunt, Seaquist, Santos, Maxwell, Bergquist, Ormsby, Orwall, Riccelli, Sells, Stonier, Reykdal, Van De Wege, Fey, Ryu, Morrell, Freeman, and Magendanz

Supporting K-12 career education, exploration, and planning.

Requires the office of the superintendent of public instruction to: (1) Develop a standard template for the high school and beyond plan required for high school graduation; and

(2) Establish criteria and an award or designation to recognize exemplary career and technical education programs.

Requires the instructional program of basic education provided by each school district to include opportunities for students to participate in career exploration, work-based learning, job shadowing, internships, development of their high school and beyond plan, student advisories, and other similar activities.

Requires the state board of education to redesignate the credit in occupational education as a credit in career and technical education.

Requires school districts to use the standard template for the high school and beyond plan.

Requires high schools to implement a comprehensive guidance and planning program for students in grades nine through twelve.

Requires school district boards of directors to grant academic course equivalency for a career and technical high school course from the mandatory course equivalency list.

Requires the education data center to develop a standard report on the postsecondary education and employment outcomes for students who graduate from the state's public high schools.

Requires the professional educator standards board to revise certificate renewal rules and standards for secondary principals.

Concerning access to juvenile records.

Addresses the confidentiality of certain juvenile court records.

Prohibits certain confidential juvenile offense records from being published, distributed, or sold.

**HB 1652** by Representatives Liias, Dahlquist, Takko, Kretz, Clibborn, Condotta, Upthegrove, Springer, Buys, and Ryu

Establishing a process for the payment of impact fees through provisions stipulated in recorded covenants.

Requires counties, cities, and towns collecting impact fees to adopt a permanent system for the collection of the fees from applicants for certain residential building permits.

**HB 1653** by Representatives Goodman, Hope, Pettigrew, Dahlquist, Pedersen, Van De Wege, Ryu, and Moscoso; by request of Attorney General

Concerning assault in the third degree occurring in areas used in connection with court proceedings.

Includes, in the crime of assault in the third degree, an assault on a person located in any area of a building that is used in connection with court proceedings.

Includes, as aggravating circumstances, an offense that involves a felony crime against persons that occurs in those areas in any building that are used in connection with court proceedings.

**HB 1654** by Representatives Riccelli, Ormsby, Fitzgibbon, Tarleton, Van De Wege, and Ryu

Establishing a regional fire protection service authority within the boundaries of a single city.

**HB 1655** by Representatives Pollet, Fitzgibbon, Upthegrove, Appleton, Ormsby, Maxwell, and Ryu

Concerning the attorney general's authority and power to prosecute environmental law violations.

Addresses the explicit and concurrent authority and power of the attorney general with regard to environmental law violations.

Establishing statewide high school graduation requirements that permit increased flexibility for students to select courses based on their interests and plans.

Declares an intent to: (1) Focus required courses for high school graduation on the core, foundational knowledge and skills that strengthen career and college readiness; and

(2) Leave additional decisions about course selection to students, parents, and local communities.

Concerning the workforce training and education coordinating board's high skills high wages plan.

Approves the state comprehensive plan for workforce training called "High Skills, High Wages."

Changes the area in which a mosquito control district may enter.

Allows a mosquito control district to cut or remove shrubbery or undergrowth under certain circumstances.

Establishing that courts may order an offender to refrain from the consumption of marijuana as a part of community custody conditions.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Authorizes a court, as part of any term of community custody, to order an offender to refrain from consuming marijuana except under a lawfully issued medical marijuana authorization, unless the department of corrections determines that consumption is inconsistent with and contrary to his or her supervision.

Makes technical corrections to certain gender-based terms.

Authorizes a unit of local government to award a contract to a bidder submitting the lowest bid before taxes are applied.

Requires the unit of local government to provide notice of its intent to award a contract based on this method before bids are submitted.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Requires Washington State University to study the feasibility and desirability of industrial hemp production in the state.

Encourages the university to conduct the study at its Everett branch campus.
