AN ACT Relating to the capital budget; making appropriations and 1 2 authorizing expenditures for capital improvements; amending 3 28B.10.027, 28B.20.725, 28B.30.750, 43.88D.010, 28B.77.070, 43.17.200, and 70.105D.070; amending 2018 c 2 ss 1019, 2019, 3024, 4 3093, and 1014, 2018 c 298 ss 1004, 2004, 2005, 2008, and 2018, and 5 2017 3rd sp. s. c 4 s 3056 (uncodified); reenacting and amending RCW 6 7 43.155.050 and 70.105D.170; adding a new section to 2018 8 (uncodified); creating new sections; making appropriations; providing 9 a contingent effective date; and declaring an emergency.

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

- 11 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. (1) A capital budget is hereby adopted 12 and, subject to the provisions set forth in this act, the several 13 dollar amounts hereinafter specified, or so much thereof as shall be 14 sufficient to accomplish the purposes designated, are 15 appropriated and authorized to be incurred for capital projects 16 during the period beginning with the effective date of this act and 17 ending June 30, 2021, out of the several funds specified in this act.
- 18 (2) The definitions in this subsection apply throughout this act 19 unless the context clearly requires otherwise.
- 20 (a) "Fiscal year 2020" or "FY 2020" means the period beginning 21 July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020.

- 1 (b) "Fiscal year 2021" or "FY 2021" means the period beginning 2 July 1, 2020, and ending June 30, 2021.
- 3 (c) "Lapse" or "revert" means the amount shall return to an unappropriated status.

- (d) "Provided solely" means the specified amount may be spent only for the specified purpose.
- (3) Unless otherwise specifically authorized in this act, any portion of an amount provided solely for a specified purpose that is not expended subject to the specified conditions and limitations to fulfill the specified purpose shall lapse.
- (4) The amounts shown under the headings "Prior Biennia," "Future Biennia," and "Total" in this act are for informational purposes only and do not constitute legislative approval of these amounts. "Prior biennia" typically refers to the immediate prior biennium for reappropriations, but may refer to multiple biennia in the case of specific projects. A "future biennia" amount is an estimate of what may be appropriated for the project or program in the 2021-2023 biennium and the following three biennia; an amount of zero does not necessarily constitute legislative intent to not provide funding for the project or program in the future.
- (5) "Reappropriations" in this act are appropriations and, unless the context clearly provides otherwise, are subject to the relevant conditions and limitations applicable to appropriations. Reappropriations shall be limited to the unexpended balances remaining on June 30, 2019, from the 2017-2019 biennial appropriations for each project.

- (3)(a) \$10,000,000 of the appropriation in this section is provided solely for loans or grants to design and construct ultrahigh energy efficient affordable housing projects.
- (b) To receive funding, a project must provide a life-cycle cost analysis report to the department and must demonstrate energy-saving and renewable energy systems either designed to reach net-zero energy use after housing is fully occupied or designed to achieve the most recent building standard of the passive house institute US as of the effective date of this section.
- (c) The department must consider, at a minimum and in any order, the following factors in assigning a numerical ranking to a project:
- (i) Whether the proposed design has demonstrated that the project will achieve either net-zero energy use when fully occupied or will achieve the most recent building standard of the passive house institute US as of the effective date of this section;
 - (ii) The life-cycle cost of the project;
- (iii) That the project demonstrates a design, use of materials, and construction process that can be replicated by the Washington building industry;
 - (iv) The extent to which the project leverages nonstate funds;
- (v) The extent to which the project is ready to proceed to construction;
- 29 (vi) Whether the project promotes sustainable use of resources 30 and environmental quality;
- (vii) Whether the project is being well-managed to fund maintenance and capital depreciation;
 - (viii) Reduction of housing and utilities carbon footprint; and
- 34 (ix) Other criteria that the department considers necessary to achieve the purpose of this program.

- (b) The funds may be provided for major building improvements, preservation, and system replacements, necessary for the existing housing trust fund portfolio to maintain or increase its long-term viability. The department must require a capital needs assessment to be provided prior to contract execution. Funds may not be used to add or expand the capacity of the property.
- 10 (c) To allocate preservation funds, the department must review 11 applications and evaluate the following criteria:
 - (i) The age of the property, with priority given to buildings that are more than fifteen years old;
 - (ii) The population served, with priority given to projects with at least fifty percent of the housing units being occupied by families and individuals at or below fifty percent of the area median income.
- 18 (iii) The degree to which the applicant demonstrates that the 19 improvements will result in reduction of operating or utilities 20 costs, or both;
- 21 (iv) The potential for additional years added to the 22 affordability period of the property; and
- 23 (v) Other criteria that the department considers necessary to achieve the purpose of this program.
- 25 (5) \$10,000,000 is provided solely for the following list of 26 housing projects:

- - (6)(a) \$75,000,000 of the appropriation is provided solely for affordable housing projects that serve and benefit low-income and special needs populations in need of housing. Of the amounts appropriated in this subsection, the department must allocate the funds as follows:
- (i) 18 percent is provided solely for housing projects that provide supportive housing and case-management services to persons with behavioral or chronic mental illness. The department must prioritize low-income supportive housing unit proposals that provide

- 1 services or include a partner community behavioral health treatment provider; 2
- (ii) 14 percent is provided solely for housing projects that 3 benefit homeless families with children; 4
- (iii) 14 percent is provided solely for housing projects that 5 6 benefit homeless veterans;

- (v) 14 percent is provided solely for housing projects that 9 benefit people with disabilities; 10
 - (vi) 10 percent is provided solely for homeownership projects;
 - (vii) The remaining amount is provided solely for projects that benefit other low-income populations including, but not limited to, farmworkers and seniors.
 - (b) The department must require payment of principal or principal and interest on loans made to affordable housing projects in which at least sixty percent of the units will be occupied by families and individuals that are at or above sixty percent of the area median income. Loan repayment deferrals must not exceed three years from construction completion.
- 21 (7) In evaluating projects in this section, the department must 22 give preference for applications based on some or all of the criteria in RCW 43.185.070(5). 23
 - (8) The department must allocate the amounts appropriated in subsections (2) and (5) of this section within the 2019-2021 fiscal biennium in the manner prescribed. However, if upon review of applications, the department determines there are not adequate suitable projects in a category of projects in subsections (2) and (5) of this section and that the full amount appropriated is not required, it is the intent of the legislature that the department may allocate the excess funds in the 2021-2023 fiscal biennium to projects serving other low-income and special needs populations, provided those projects are located in an area with an identified need for the type of housing proposed.

The department of commerce will oversee an interagency agreement with the department of enterprise services to fund the resource conservation managers.
 - (5) The department shall develop metrics that indicate the performance of energy efficiency efforts and provide a report of the metrics, including at a minimum the current energy used by the building, the energy use after efficiencies are completed, and cost of energy saved. The report must include these metrics from other states.

MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

NEW SECTION. Sec. 7001. RCW 43.88.031 requires the disclosure of the estimated debt service costs associated with new capital bond appropriations. The estimated debt service costs for the appropriations contained in this act are fifty-four million, five hundred four thousand dollars for the 2019-2021 biennium, three hundred thirty-eight million, seven thousand dollars for the 2021-2023 biennium, and four hundred seventy-five million, three hundred thirty-seven thousand dollars for the 2023-2025 biennium.

7002. NEW SECTION. Sec. ACQUISITION OF PROPERTIES FACILITIES THROUGH FINANCIAL CONTRACTS. (1) The following agencies may enter into financial contracts, paid from any funds of an agency, appropriated or nonappropriated, for the purposes indicated and in more than the principal amounts indicated, plus financing expenses and required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW. When securing properties under this section, agencies shall use the most economical financial contract option available, including long-term leases, lease-purchase agreements, lease-development with option to purchase agreements or financial contracts using certificates of participation. Expenditures made by an agency for one of the indicated purposes before the issue date of the authorized financial contract and any certificates of participation therein are intended to be reimbursed from proceeds of the financial contract and any certificates of participation therein to the extent provided in the agency's financing plan approved by the state finance committee.

- (2) Those noninstructional facilities of higher education institutions authorized in this section to enter into financial contracts are not eligible for state funded maintenance and operations. Instructional space that is available for regularly scheduled classes for academic transfer, basic skills, and workforce training programs may be eligible for state funded maintenance and operations.
- 34 (3) Department of enterprise services: Enter into a financing 35 contract for up to \$5,000,000 plus financing expenses and required 36 reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to purchase and install 37 electric vehicle infrastructure at state facilities.

- (6) Department of natural resources: Enter into a financing contract for up to \$1,800,000 plus financing expenses and required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to remodel spaces within agency-owned commercial buildings that will benefit the common school trust.
 - (7) Community and technical colleges:

- (a) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Columbia Basin Community College for up to \$27,000,000 plus financing expenses and required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to construct a student recreation center.
- (b) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Pierce College Puyallup for up to \$2,831,000 plus financing expenses and required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to purchase land and construct parking.
- (c) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Walla Walla Community College for up to \$1,500,000 plus financing expenses and required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to build a student activity center on the Clarkston campus.
- (d) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Walla Walla Community College for up to \$6,500,000 plus financing expenses and required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to build a student recreation center.
- 31 (e) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Wenatchee Valley 32 College for up to \$4,500,000 plus financing expenses and required 33 reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW for the Wells Hall replacement 34 project.

 - (4) A report of any transfer effected under this section, except emergency projects or any transfer under \$250,000, shall be filed with the legislative fiscal committees of the senate and house of representatives by the office of financial management at least thirty days before the date the transfer is effected. The office of financial management shall report all emergency or smaller transfers within thirty days from the date of transfer.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 7007. (1) It is expected that projects be ready to proceed in a timely manner depending on the type or phase of the project or program that is the subject of the appropriation in this act. - (a) Employ integrated design principles: Use a collaborative, integrated planning and design process that initiates and maintains an integrated project team in all stages of a project's planning and delivery. Establish performance goals for siting, energy, water, materials, and indoor environmental quality along with other comprehensive design goals and ensures incorporation of these goals throughout the design and life-cycle of the building. Consider all stages of the building's life-cycle, including deconstruction.
- (b) Commissioning: Employ commissioning practices tailored to the size and complexity of the building and its system components in order to verify performance of building components and systems and
