- 1 AN ACT Relating to establishing a medicaid baseline health
- 2 assessment and monitoring the medicaid population's health; and
- 3 amending RCW 70.320.030, 70.320.040, and 70.320.050.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 70.320.030 and 2013 c 320 s 3 are each amended to 6 read as follows:
- 7 By September 1, 2014:
- 8 (1) The authority shall adopt performance measures to determine 9 whether service contracting entities are achieving the outcomes 10 described in RCW 70.320.020 and 41.05.690 for clients enrolled in 11 medical managed care programs operated according to Title XIX or XXI
- 12 of the federal social security act.
- 13 (2) The department shall adopt performance measures to determine
- 14 whether service contracting entities are achieving the outcomes
- 15 described in RCW 70.320.020 for clients receiving mental health,
- 16 long-term care, or chemical dependency services.
- 17 Sec. 2. RCW 70.320.040 and 2013 c 320 s 4 are each amended to
- 18 read as follows:

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- By July 1, 2015, the authority and the department shall require that contracts with service coordination organizations include provisions requiring:
- 4 <u>(1) The</u> adoption of the outcomes and performance measures 5 developed under this chapter <u>and RCW 41.05.690</u> and mechanisms for 6 reporting data to support each of the outcomes and performance 7 measures; and
- 8 (2) That an initial health screen be conducted for new enrollees
  9 pursuant to the terms and conditions of the contract.
- 10 **Sec. 3.** RCW 70.320.050 and 2013 c 320 s 5 are each amended to 11 read as follows:

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- (1) By December 1, 2014, the department and the authority shall report jointly to the legislature on the expected outcomes and the performance measures. The report must identify the performance measures and the expected outcomes established for each program, the relationship between the performance measures and expected improvements in client outcomes, mechanisms for reporting outcomes and measuring performance, and options for applying the performance measures and expected outcomes development process to other health and social service programs.
- (2) By December 1, 2016, <u>and annually thereafter</u>, the department and the authority shall report to the legislature on the incorporation of the performance measures into contracts with service coordination organizations and progress toward achieving the identified outcomes. <u>The report shall include:</u>
- 26 <u>(a) The number of medicaid clients enrolled over the previous</u> 27 year;
- 28 <u>(b) The number of enrollees who received a baseline health</u>
  29 assessment over the previous year;
- 30 (c) An analysis of trends in health improvement for medicaid 31 enrollees in accordance with the measure set established under RCW 32 41.05.065; and
- 33 <u>(d) Recommendations for improving the health of medicaid</u> 34 <u>enrollees.</u>
