1 AN ACT Relating to adjusting the medicaid reimbursement system;
2 amending RCW 70.38.111, 74.46.020, 74.46.431, 74.46.435, 74.46.437,
3 74.46.445, 74.46.506, 74.46.511, and 74.46.521; providing an effective
4 date; and declaring an emergency.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 **Sec. 1.** RCW 70.38.111 and 1997 c 210 s 1 are each amended to read
7 as follows:

8 (1) The department shall not require a certificate of need for the
9 offering of an inpatient tertiary health service by:

10 (a) A health maintenance organization or a combination of health
11 maintenance organizations if (i) the organization or combination of
12 organizations has, in the service area of the organization or the
13 service areas of the organizations in the combination, an enrollment of
14 at least fifty thousand individuals, (ii) the facility in which the
15 service will be provided is or will be geographically located so that
16 the service will be reasonably accessible to such enrolled individuals,
17 and (iii) at least seventy-five percent of the patients who can
18 reasonably be expected to receive the tertiary health service will be

1 individuals enrolled with such organization or organizations in the
2 combination;

3 (b) A health care facility if (i) the facility primarily provides
4 or will provide inpatient health services, (ii) the facility is or will
5 be controlled, directly or indirectly, by a health maintenance
6 organization or a combination of health maintenance organizations which
7 has, in the service area of the organization or service areas of the
8 organizations in the combination, an enrollment of at least fifty
9 thousand individuals, (iii) the facility is or will be geographically
10 located so that the service will be reasonably accessible to such
11 enrolled individuals, and (iv) at least seventy-five percent of the
12 patients who can reasonably be expected to receive the tertiary health
13 service will be individuals enrolled with such organization or
14 organizations in the combination; or

15 (c) A health care facility (or portion thereof) if (i) the facility
16 is or will be leased by a health maintenance organization or
17 combination of health maintenance organizations which has, in the
18 service area of the organization or the service areas of the
19 organizations in the combination, an enrollment of at least fifty
20 thousand individuals and, on the date the application is submitted
21 under subsection (2) of this section, at least fifteen years remain in
22 the term of the lease, (ii) the facility is or will be geographically
23 located so that the service will be reasonably accessible to such
24 enrolled individuals, and (iii) at least seventy-five percent of the
25 patients who can reasonably be expected to receive the tertiary health
26 service will be individuals enrolled with such organization;
27 if, with respect to such offering or obligation by a nursing home, the
28 department has, upon application under subsection (2) of this section,
29 granted an exemption from such requirement to the organization,
30 combination of organizations, or facility.

31 (2) A health maintenance organization, combination of health
32 maintenance organizations, or health care facility shall not be exempt
33 under subsection (1) of this section from obtaining a certificate of
34 need before offering a tertiary health service unless:

35 (a) It has submitted at least thirty days prior to the offering of
36 services reviewable under RCW 70.38.105(4)(d) an application for such
37 exemption; and

1 (b) The application contains such information respecting the
2 organization, combination, or facility and the proposed offering or
3 obligation by a nursing home as the department may require to determine
4 if the organization or combination meets the requirements of subsection
5 (1) of this section or the facility meets or will meet such
6 requirements; and

7 (c) The department approves such application. The department shall
8 approve or disapprove an application for exemption within thirty days
9 of receipt of a completed application. In the case of a proposed
10 health care facility (or portion thereof) which has not begun to
11 provide tertiary health services on the date an application is
12 submitted under this subsection with respect to such facility (or
13 portion), the facility (or portion) shall meet the applicable
14 requirements of subsection (1) of this section when the facility first
15 provides such services. The department shall approve an application
16 submitted under this subsection if it determines that the applicable
17 requirements of subsection (1) of this section are met.

18 (3) A health care facility (or any part thereof) with respect to
19 which an exemption was granted under subsection (1) of this section may
20 not be sold or leased and a controlling interest in such facility or in
21 a lease of such facility may not be acquired and a health care facility
22 described in (1)(c) which was granted an exemption under subsection (1)
23 of this section may not be used by any person other than the lessee
24 described in (1)(c) unless:

25 (a) The department issues a certificate of need approving the sale,
26 lease, acquisition, or use; or

27 (b) The department determines, upon application, that (i) the
28 entity to which the facility is proposed to be sold or leased, which
29 intends to acquire the controlling interest, or which intends to use
30 the facility is a health maintenance organization or a combination of
31 health maintenance organizations which meets the requirements of
32 (1)(a)(i), and (ii) with respect to such facility, meets the
33 requirements of (1)(a)(ii) or (iii) or the requirements of (1)(b)(i)
34 and (ii).

35 (4) In the case of a health maintenance organization, an ambulatory
36 care facility, or a health care facility, which ambulatory or health
37 care facility is controlled, directly or indirectly, by a health
38 maintenance organization or a combination of health maintenance

1 organizations, the department may under the program apply its
2 certificate of need requirements only to the offering of inpatient
3 tertiary health services and then only to the extent that such offering
4 is not exempt under the provisions of this section.

5 (5)(a) The department shall not require a certificate of need for
6 the construction, development, or other establishment of a nursing
7 home, or the addition of beds to an existing nursing home, that is
8 owned and operated by a continuing care retirement community that:

9 (i) Offers services only to contractual members;

10 (ii) Provides its members a contractually guaranteed range of
11 services from independent living through skilled nursing, including
12 some assistance with daily living activities;

13 (iii) Contractually assumes responsibility for the cost of services
14 exceeding the member's financial responsibility under the contract, so
15 that no third party, with the exception of insurance purchased by the
16 retirement community or its members, but including the medicaid
17 program, is liable for costs of care even if the member depletes his or
18 her personal resources;

19 (iv) Has offered continuing care contracts and operated a nursing
20 home continuously since January 1, 1988, or has obtained a certificate
21 of need to establish a nursing home;

22 (v) Maintains a binding agreement with the state assuring that
23 financial liability for services to members, including nursing home
24 services, will not fall upon the state;

25 (vi) Does not operate, and has not undertaken a project that would
26 result in a number of nursing home beds in excess of one for every four
27 living units operated by the continuing care retirement community,
28 exclusive of nursing home beds; and

29 (vii) Has obtained a professional review of pricing and long-term
30 solvency within the prior five years which was fully disclosed to
31 members.

32 (b) A continuing care retirement community shall not be exempt
33 under this subsection from obtaining a certificate of need unless:

34 (i) It has submitted an application for exemption at least thirty
35 days prior to commencing construction of, is submitting an application
36 for the licensure of, or is commencing operation of a nursing home,
37 whichever comes first; and

1 (ii) The application documents to the department that the
2 continuing care retirement community qualifies for exemption.

3 (c) The sale, lease, acquisition, or use of part or all of a
4 continuing care retirement community nursing home that qualifies for
5 exemption under this subsection shall require prior certificate of need
6 approval to qualify for licensure as a nursing home unless the
7 department determines such sale, lease, acquisition, or use is by a
8 continuing care retirement community that meets the conditions of (a)
9 of this subsection.

10 (6) A rural hospital, as defined by the department, reducing the
11 number of licensed beds to become a rural primary care hospital under
12 the provisions of Part A Title XVIII of the Social Security Act Section
13 1820, 42 U.S.C., 1395c et seq. may, within three years of the reduction
14 of beds licensed under chapter 70.41 RCW, increase the number of
15 licensed beds to no more than the previously licensed number without
16 being subject to the provisions of this chapter.

17 (7) A rural health care facility licensed under RCW 70.175.100
18 formerly licensed as a hospital under chapter 70.41 RCW may, within
19 three years of the effective date of the rural health care facility
20 license, apply to the department for a hospital license and not be
21 subject to the requirements of RCW 70.38.105(4)(a) as the construction,
22 development, or other establishment of a new hospital, provided there
23 is no increase in the number of beds previously licensed under chapter
24 70.41 RCW and there is no redistribution in the number of beds used for
25 acute care or long-term care, the rural health care facility has been
26 in continuous operation, and the rural health care facility has not
27 been purchased or leased.

28 (8)(a) A nursing home that voluntarily reduces the number of its
29 licensed beds to provide assisted living, licensed boarding home care,
30 adult day care, adult day health, respite care, hospice, outpatient
31 therapy services, congregate meals, home health, or senior wellness
32 clinic, or to reduce to one or two the number of beds per room or to
33 otherwise enhance the quality of life for residents in the nursing
34 home, may convert the original facility or portion of the facility
35 back, and thereby increase the number of nursing home beds to no more
36 than the previously licensed number of nursing home beds without
37 obtaining a certificate of need under this chapter, provided the
38 facility has been in continuous operation and has not been purchased or

1 leased. Any conversion to the original licensed bed capacity, or to
2 any portion thereof, shall comply with the same life and safety code
3 requirements as existed at the time the nursing home voluntarily
4 reduced its licensed beds; unless waivers from such requirements were
5 issued, in which case the converted beds shall reflect the conditions
6 or standards that then existed pursuant to the approved waivers.

7 (b) To convert beds back to nursing home beds under this
8 subsection, the nursing home must:

9 (i) Give notice of its intent to preserve conversion options to the
10 department of health no later than thirty days after the effective date
11 of the license reduction; and

12 (ii) Give notice to the department of health and to the department
13 of social and health services of the intent to convert beds back. If
14 construction is required for the conversion of beds back, the notice of
15 intent to convert beds back must be given, at a minimum, one year prior
16 to the effective date of license modification reflecting the restored
17 beds; otherwise, the notice must be given a minimum of ninety days
18 prior to the effective date of license modification reflecting the
19 restored beds. Prior to any license modification to convert beds back
20 to nursing home beds under this section, the licensee must demonstrate
21 that the nursing home meets the certificate of need exemption
22 requirements of this section.

23 The term "construction," as used in (b)(ii) of this subsection, is
24 limited to those projects that are expected to equal or exceed the
25 expenditure minimum amount, as determined under this chapter.

26 (c) Conversion of beds back under this subsection must be completed
27 no later than (~~four~~) ten years after the effective date of the
28 license reduction. However, for good cause shown, the (~~four~~) ten-
29 year period for conversion may be extended by the department of health
30 for one additional (~~four~~) ten-year period. Contractors currently
31 banking beds under the provisions of this chapter shall be granted an
32 additional ten-year period upon the expiration of the bed-banking
33 period currently in effect.

34 (d) Nursing home beds that have been voluntarily reduced under this
35 section shall be counted as available nursing home beds for the purpose
36 of evaluating need under RCW 70.38.115(2) (a) and (k) so long as the
37 facility retains the ability to convert them back to nursing home use
38 under the terms of this section.

1 (e) When a building owner has secured an interest in the nursing
2 home beds, which are intended to be voluntarily reduced by the licensee
3 under (a) of this subsection, the applicant shall provide the
4 department with a written statement indicating the building owner's
5 approval of the bed reduction.

6 **Sec. 2.** RCW 74.46.020 and 2001 1st sp.s. c 8 s 1 are each amended
7 to read as follows:

8 Unless the context clearly requires otherwise, the definitions in
9 this section apply throughout this chapter.

10 (1) "Accrual method of accounting" means a method of accounting in
11 which revenues are reported in the period when they are earned,
12 regardless of when they are collected, and expenses are reported in the
13 period in which they are incurred, regardless of when they are paid.

14 (2) "Actual patient day" means a calendar day of care provided to
15 a nursing facility resident, regardless of payment source, which
16 includes the day of admission and excludes the day of discharge. When
17 used for rate setting purposes, the term "actual patient days" or
18 "total patient days" means the total number of days of care provided to
19 residents by the nursing facility regardless of payment sources.

20 (3) "Adjusted patient days" or "adjusted resident days" or "audited
21 patient days" means those actual patient days accepted by the
22 department for rate setting purposes after a desk review or desk audit.

23 (4) "Appraisal" means the process of estimating the fair market
24 value or reconstructing the historical cost of an asset acquired in a
25 past period as performed by a professionally designated real estate
26 appraiser with no pecuniary interest in the property to be appraised.
27 It includes a systematic, analytic determination and the recording and
28 analyzing of property facts, rights, investments, and values based on
29 a personal inspection and inventory of the property.

30 ((+3)) (5) "Arm's-length transaction" means a transaction
31 resulting from good-faith bargaining between a buyer and seller who are
32 not related organizations and have adverse positions in the market
33 place. Sales or exchanges of nursing home facilities among two or more
34 parties in which all parties subsequently continue to own one or more
35 of the facilities involved in the transactions shall not be considered
36 as arm's-length transactions for purposes of this chapter. Sale of a

1 nursing home facility which is subsequently leased back to the seller
2 within five years of the date of sale shall not be considered as an
3 arm's-length transaction for purposes of this chapter.

4 ~~((4))~~ (6) "Assets" means economic resources of the contractor,
5 recognized and measured in conformity with generally accepted
6 accounting principles.

7 ~~((5))~~ (7) "Audit" or "department audit" means an examination of
8 the records of a nursing facility participating in the medicaid payment
9 system, including but not limited to: The contractor's financial and
10 statistical records, cost reports and all supporting documentation and
11 schedules, receivables, and resident trust funds, to be performed as
12 deemed necessary by the department and according to department rule.

13 ~~((6))~~ (8) "Bad debts" means amounts considered to be
14 uncollectible from accounts and notes receivable.

15 ~~((7))~~ (9) "Beneficial owner" means:

16 (a) Any person who, directly or indirectly, through any contract,
17 arrangement, understanding, relationship, or otherwise has or shares:

18 (i) Voting power which includes the power to vote, or to direct the
19 voting of such ownership interest; and/or

20 (ii) Investment power which includes the power to dispose, or to
21 direct the disposition of such ownership interest;

22 (b) Any person who, directly or indirectly, creates or uses a
23 trust, proxy, power of attorney, pooling arrangement, or any other
24 contract, arrangement, or device with the purpose or effect of
25 divesting himself or herself of beneficial ownership of an ownership
26 interest or preventing the vesting of such beneficial ownership as part
27 of a plan or scheme to evade the reporting requirements of this
28 chapter;

29 (c) Any person who, subject to (b) of this subsection, has the
30 right to acquire beneficial ownership of such ownership interest within
31 sixty days, including but not limited to any right to acquire:

32 (i) Through the exercise of any option, warrant, or right;

33 (ii) Through the conversion of an ownership interest;

34 (iii) Pursuant to the power to revoke a trust, discretionary
35 account, or similar arrangement; or

36 (iv) Pursuant to the automatic termination of a trust,
37 discretionary account, or similar arrangement;

38 except that, any person who acquires an ownership interest or power

1 specified in (c)(i), (ii), or (iii) of this subsection with the purpose
2 or effect of changing or influencing the control of the contractor, or
3 in connection with or as a participant in any transaction having such
4 purpose or effect, immediately upon such acquisition shall be deemed to
5 be the beneficial owner of the ownership interest which may be acquired
6 through the exercise or conversion of such ownership interest or power;

7 (d) Any person who in the ordinary course of business is a pledgee
8 of ownership interest under a written pledge agreement shall not be
9 deemed to be the beneficial owner of such pledged ownership interest
10 until the pledgee has taken all formal steps necessary which are
11 required to declare a default and determines that the power to vote or
12 to direct the vote or to dispose or to direct the disposition of such
13 pledged ownership interest will be exercised; except that:

14 (i) The pledgee agreement is bona fide and was not entered into
15 with the purpose nor with the effect of changing or influencing the
16 control of the contractor, nor in connection with any transaction
17 having such purpose or effect, including persons meeting the conditions
18 set forth in (b) of this subsection; and

19 (ii) The pledgee agreement, prior to default, does not grant to the
20 pledgee:

21 (A) The power to vote or to direct the vote of the pledged
22 ownership interest; or

23 (B) The power to dispose or direct the disposition of the pledged
24 ownership interest, other than the grant of such power(s) pursuant to
25 a pledge agreement under which credit is extended and in which the
26 pledgee is a broker or dealer.

27 (~~(+8)~~) (10) "Capitalization" means the recording of an expenditure
28 as an asset.

29 (~~(+9)~~) (11) "Case mix" means a measure of the intensity of care
30 and services needed by the residents of a nursing facility or a group
31 of residents in the facility.

32 (~~(+10)~~) (12) "Case mix index" means a number representing the
33 average case mix of a nursing facility.

34 (~~(+11)~~) (13) "Case mix weight" means a numeric score that
35 identifies the relative resources used by a particular group of a
36 nursing facility's residents.

37 (~~(+12)~~) (14) "Certificate of capital authorization" means a
38 certification from the department for an allocation from the biennial

1 capital financing authorization for all new or replacement building
2 construction, or for major renovation projects, receiving a certificate
3 of need or a certificate of need exemption under chapter 70.38 RCW
4 after July 1, 2001.

5 ~~((+13))~~ (15) "Contractor" means a person or entity licensed under
6 chapter 18.51 RCW to operate a medicare and medicaid certified nursing
7 facility, responsible for operational decisions, and contracting with
8 the department to provide services to medicaid recipients residing in
9 the facility.

10 ~~((+14))~~ (16) "Default case" means no initial assessment has been
11 completed for a resident and transmitted to the department by the
12 cut-off date, or an assessment is otherwise past due for the resident,
13 under state and federal requirements.

14 ~~((+15))~~ (17) "Department" means the department of social and
15 health services (DSHS) and its employees.

16 ~~((+16))~~ (18) "Depreciation" means the systematic distribution of
17 the cost or other basis of tangible assets, less salvage, over the
18 estimated useful life of the assets.

19 ~~((+17))~~ (19) "Direct care" means nursing care and related care
20 provided to nursing facility residents. Therapy care shall not be
21 considered part of direct care.

22 ~~((+18))~~ (20) "Direct care supplies" means medical, pharmaceutical,
23 and other supplies required for the direct care of a nursing facility's
24 residents.

25 ~~((+19))~~ (21) "Entity" means an individual, partnership,
26 corporation, limited liability company, or any other association of
27 individuals capable of entering enforceable contracts.

28 ~~((+20))~~ (22) "Equity" means the net book value of all tangible and
29 intangible assets less the recorded value of all liabilities, as
30 recognized and measured in conformity with generally accepted
31 accounting principles.

32 ~~((+21))~~ (23) "Essential community provider" means a facility which
33 is the only nursing facility within a commuting distance radius of at
34 least forty minutes duration, traveling by automobile.

35 ~~((+22))~~ (24) "Facility" or "nursing facility" means a nursing home
36 licensed in accordance with chapter 18.51 RCW, excepting nursing homes
37 certified as institutions for mental diseases, or that portion of a

1 multiservice facility licensed as a nursing home, or that portion of a
2 hospital licensed in accordance with chapter 70.41 RCW which operates
3 as a nursing home.

4 ~~((+23))~~ (25) "Fair market value" means the replacement cost of an
5 asset less observed physical depreciation on the date for which the
6 market value is being determined.

7 ~~((+24))~~ (26) "Financial statements" means statements prepared and
8 presented in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles
9 including, but not limited to, balance sheet, statement of operations,
10 statement of changes in financial position, and related notes.

11 ~~((+25))~~ (27) "Generally accepted accounting principles" means
12 accounting principles approved by the financial accounting standards
13 board (FASB).

14 ~~((+26))~~ (28) "Goodwill" means the excess of the price paid for a
15 nursing facility business over the fair market value of all net
16 identifiable tangible and intangible assets acquired, as measured in
17 accordance with generally accepted accounting principles.

18 ~~((+27))~~ (29) "Grouper" means a computer software product that
19 groups individual nursing facility residents into case mix
20 classification groups based on specific resident assessment data and
21 computer logic.

22 ~~((+28))~~ (30) "High labor-cost county" means an urban county in
23 which the median allowable facility cost per case mix unit is more than
24 ten percent higher than the median allowable facility cost per case mix
25 unit among all other urban counties, excluding that county.

26 ~~((+29))~~ (31) "Historical cost" means the actual cost incurred in
27 acquiring and preparing an asset for use, including feasibility
28 studies, architect's fees, and engineering studies.

29 ~~((+30))~~ (32) "Home and central office costs" means costs that are
30 incurred in the support and operation of a home and central office.
31 Home and central office costs include centralized services that are
32 performed in support of a nursing facility. The department may exclude
33 from this definition costs that are nonduplicative, documented,
34 ordinary, necessary, and related to the provision of care services to
35 authorized patients.

36 ~~((+31))~~ (33) "Imprest fund" means a fund which is regularly
37 replenished in exactly the amount expended from it.

1 ~~((32))~~ (34) "Joint facility costs" means any costs which
2 represent resources which benefit more than one facility, or one
3 facility and any other entity.

4 ~~((33))~~ (35) "Lease agreement" means a contract between two
5 parties for the possession and use of real or personal property or
6 assets for a specified period of time in exchange for specified
7 periodic payments. Elimination (due to any cause other than death or
8 divorce) or addition of any party to the contract, expiration, or
9 modification of any lease term in effect on January 1, 1980, or
10 termination of the lease by either party by any means shall constitute
11 a termination of the lease agreement. An extension or renewal of a
12 lease agreement, whether or not pursuant to a renewal provision in the
13 lease agreement, shall be considered a new lease agreement. A strictly
14 formal change in the lease agreement which modifies the method,
15 frequency, or manner in which the lease payments are made, but does not
16 increase the total lease payment obligation of the lessee, shall not be
17 considered modification of a lease term.

18 ~~((34))~~ (36) "Licensed beds" or "licensed bed capacity" means a
19 facility's occupied bed and beds available for occupancy. "Licensed
20 beds" or "licensed bed capacity" shall never include beds banked under
21 chapter 70.38 RCW or beds permanently removed from service under the
22 provisions of this chapter.

23 (37) "Medical care program" or "medicaid program" means medical
24 assistance, including nursing care, provided under RCW 74.09.500 or
25 authorized state medical care services.

26 ~~((35))~~ (38) "Medical care recipient," "medicaid recipient," or
27 "recipient" means an individual determined eligible by the department
28 for the services provided under chapter 74.09 RCW.

29 ~~((36))~~ (39) "Minimum data set" means the overall data component
30 of the resident assessment instrument, indicating the strengths, needs,
31 and preferences of an individual nursing facility resident.

32 ~~((37))~~ (40) "Net book value" means the historical cost of an
33 asset less accumulated depreciation.

34 ~~((38))~~ (41) "Net invested funds" means the net book value of
35 tangible fixed assets employed by a contractor to provide services
36 under the medical care program, including land, buildings, and
37 equipment as recognized and measured in conformity with generally
38 accepted accounting principles.

1 ~~((39))~~ (42) "Nonurban county" means a county which is not located
2 in a metropolitan statistical area as determined and defined by the
3 United States office of management and budget or other appropriate
4 agency or office of the federal government.

5 ~~((40))~~ (43) "Operating lease" means a lease under which rental or
6 lease expenses are included in current expenses in accordance with
7 generally accepted accounting principles.

8 ~~((41))~~ (44) "Owner" means a sole proprietor, general or limited
9 partners, members of a limited liability company, and beneficial
10 interest holders of five percent or more of a corporation's outstanding
11 stock.

12 ~~((42))~~ (45) "Ownership interest" means all interests beneficially
13 owned by a person, calculated in the aggregate, regardless of the form
14 which such beneficial ownership takes.

15 ~~((43))~~ (46) "Patient day" or "resident day" means a calendar day
16 of care provided to a nursing facility resident, regardless of payment
17 source, which will include the day of admission and exclude the day of
18 discharge; except that, when admission and discharge occur on the same
19 day, one day of care shall be deemed to exist. A "medicaid day" or
20 "recipient day" means a calendar day of care provided to a medicaid
21 recipient determined eligible by the department for services provided
22 under chapter 74.09 RCW, subject to the same conditions regarding
23 admission and discharge applicable to a patient day or resident day of
24 care.

25 ~~((44))~~ (47) "Professionally designated real estate appraiser"
26 means an individual who is regularly engaged in the business of
27 providing real estate valuation services for a fee, and who is deemed
28 qualified by a nationally recognized real estate appraisal educational
29 organization on the basis of extensive practical appraisal experience,
30 including the writing of real estate valuation reports as well as the
31 passing of written examinations on valuation practice and theory, and
32 who by virtue of membership in such organization is required to
33 subscribe and adhere to certain standards of professional practice as
34 such organization prescribes.

35 ~~((45))~~ (48) "Provider fees" means taxes and assessments levied by
36 any state or local government, in the form of real estate or property
37 taxes, the quality maintenance fee levied pursuant to chapter 82.71

1 RCW, and the business and occupation tax levied pursuant to chapter
2 82.04 RCW.

3 (49) "Qualified therapist" means:
