- 8 property provided under this chapter, the police authorities of a city
- 9 or town may donate unclaimed ((bicycles, tricycles, and toys)) personal
- 10 property to nonprofit charitable organizations ((for use by)). A
- 11 nonprofit charitable organization receiving personal property donated
- 12 <u>under this section must use the property, or its proceeds, to benefit</u>
- 13 needy persons.
- 14 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 63.35 RCW
- 15 to read as follows:
- In addition to any other method of disposition of unclaimed
- 17 property provided under this chapter, the state patrol may donate

In addition to any other method of disposition of unclaimed property provided under this chapter, the county sheriff may donate unclaimed ((bicycles, tricycles, and toys)) personal property to nonprofit charitable organizations ((for use by)). A nonprofit charitable organization receiving personal property donated under this section must use the property, or its proceeds, to benefit needy persons.
