1 AN ACT Relating to special license plates for parents of United
2 States armed forces members who have died while in service to his or
3 her country or as a result of such service; amending RCW 46.16.725;
4 reenacting and amending RCW 46.16.305; and creating a new section.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 **Sec. 1.** RCW 46.16.305 and 1997 c 291 s 6 and 1997 c 241 s 10 are
7 each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

8 The department shall continue to issue the categories of special
9 plates issued by the department under the sections repealed under
10 section 12 (1) through (7), chapter 250, Laws of 1990. Special license
11 plates issued under those repealed sections before January 1, 1991, are
12 valid to the extent and under the conditions provided in those repealed
13 sections. The following conditions, limitations, or requirements apply
14 to certain special license plates issued after January 1, 1991:

15 (1) A horseless carriage plate and a plate or plates issued for
16 collectors' vehicles more than thirty years old, upon payment of the
17 initial fees required by law and the additional special license plate
18 fee established by the department, are valid for the life of the

1 vehicle for which application is approved by the department. When a
2 single plate is issued, it shall be displayed on the rear of the
3 vehicle.

4 (2) The department may issue special license plates denoting
5 amateur radio operator status only to persons having a valid official
6 radio operator license issued by the federal communications commission.

7 (3) The department shall issue one set of special license plates to
8 each resident of this state who has been awarded the Congressional
9 Medal of Honor for use on a passenger vehicle registered to that
10 person. The department shall issue the plate without the payment of
11 licensing fees and motor vehicle excise tax.

12 (4) The department may issue for use on only one motor vehicle
13 owned by the qualified applicant special license plates denoting that
14 the recipient of the plate is a survivor of the attack on Pearl Harbor
15 on December 7, 1941, to persons meeting all of the following criteria:

- 16 (a) Is a resident of this state;
- 17 (b) Was a member of the United States Armed Forces on December 7,
18 1941;
- 19 (c) Was on station on December 7, 1941, during the hours of 7:55
20 a.m. to 9:45 a.m. Hawaii time at Pearl Harbor, the island of Oahu, or
21 offshore at a distance not to exceed three miles;
- 22 (d) Received an honorable discharge from the United States Armed
23 Forces; and
- 24 (e) Is certified by a Washington state chapter of the Pearl Harbor
25 survivors association as satisfying the qualifications in (c) of this
26 subsection.

27 The department may issue such plates to the surviving spouse of any
28 deceased Pearl Harbor survivor who met the requirements of this
29 subsection. If the surviving spouse remarries, he or she shall return
30 the special plates to the department within fifteen days and apply for
31 regular plates. The surviving spouse must be a resident of this state.

32 The department shall issue these plates upon payment by the
33 applicant of all other license fees, but the department may not set or
34 charge an additional fee for these special license plates.

35 (5) Effective with registrations that are due or become due on or
36 after January 1, 2009, the department may issue for use on motor
37 vehicles owned by the qualified applicant special license plates
38 denoting that the recipient of the plate is a parent of a member of the

1 United States armed forces who died while in service to his or her
2 country or as a result of such service to persons meeting all of the
3 following criteria:

4 (a) Is a resident of this state; and

5 (b) Is a mother or father of a member of the United States armed
6 forces who died while in service to his or her country or who died as
7 a result of such service, as certified by the Washington state
8 department of veterans affairs.

9 The department shall issue these plates upon payment by the
10 applicant of all other license fees, but the department may not set or
11 charge an additional fee for these special plates.

12 (6) The department shall replace, free of charge, special license
13 plates issued under subsections (3) (~~and (4)~~) through (5) of this
14 section if they are lost, stolen, damaged, defaced, or destroyed. Such
15 plates shall remain with the persons upon transfer or other disposition
16 of the vehicle for which they were initially issued, and may be used on
17 another vehicle registered to the recipient in accordance with the
18 provisions of RCW 46.16.316(1).

19 **Sec. 2.** RCW 46.16.725 and 2007 c 518 s 711 are each amended to
20 read as follows:

21 (1) The creation of the board does not in any way preclude the
22 authority of the legislature to independently propose and enact special
23 license plate legislation.

24 (2) The board must review and either approve or reject special
25 license plate applications submitted by sponsoring organizations.

26 (3) Duties of the board include but are not limited to the
27 following:

28 (a) Review and approve the annual financial reports submitted by
29 sponsoring organizations with active special license plate series and
30 present those annual financial reports to the senate and house
31 transportation committees;

32 (b) Report annually to the senate and house transportation
33 committees on the special license plate applications that were
34 considered by the board;

35 (c) Issue approval and rejection notification letters to sponsoring
36 organizations, the department, the chairs of the senate and house of

1 representatives transportation committees, and the legislative sponsors
2 identified in each application. The letters must be issued within
3 seven days of making a determination on the status of an application;

4 (d) Review annually the number of plates sold for each special
5 license plate series created after January 1, 2003. The board may
6 submit a recommendation to discontinue a special plate series to the
7 chairs of the senate and house of representatives transportation
8 committees;

9 (e) Provide policy guidance and directions to the department
10 concerning the adoption of rules necessary to limit the number of
11 special license plates that an organization or a governmental entity
12 may apply for.

13 (4) Except as provided in this act, in order to assess the effects
14 and impact of the proliferation of special license plates, the
15 legislature declares a temporary moratorium on the issuance of any
16 additional plates until July 1, 2009. During this period of time, the
17 special license plate review board created in RCW 46.16.705 and the
18 department of licensing are prohibited from accepting, reviewing,
19 processing, or approving any applications. Additionally, no special
20 license plate may be enacted by the legislature during the moratorium,
21 unless the proposed license plate has been approved by the board before
22 February 15, 2005.

23 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 3.** Section 1 of this act is exempt from the
24 requirements of RCW 46.16.775.

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
