1 AN ACT Relating to capital grants for integrated long-term care
2 worker training labs in the community and technical college system;
3 adding new sections to chapter 28B.50 RCW; creating a new section; and
4 providing an expiration date.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 28B.50 RCW
7 to read as follows:

8 (1) Subject to funding provided specifically for the purposes of
9 this section, the state board for community and technical colleges, in
10 consultation with the exclusive bargaining representative of individual
11 providers under RCW 74.39A.270, shall allocate capital grants on a
12 competitive basis to up to four community college pilot sites for the
13 delivery of training and workforce development services for long-term
14 care workers required under chapter 74.39A RCW. Moneys must be used to
15 renovate or expand existing community college facilities, or to acquire
16 land and facilities in close proximity to a community college campus,
17 to accommodate programs that provide home and community-like long-term
18 care settings, including the installation of durable medical equipment
19 such as assistive devices, lifts, and remote technologies. Community

1 colleges eligible to participate in the pilot program must be located
2 in a county with a population of two hundred thousand or more.
3 Priority consideration must be given to community college applicants:
4 (a) With existing allied health care programs; and (b) that can
5 demonstrate tangible commitments to the project by business or other
6 community partners.

7 (2) This section expires July 1, 2015.

8 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 28B.50 RCW
9 to read as follows:

10 By December 1, 2014, the state board for community and technical
11 colleges shall file a report with the capital budget and higher
12 education committees of the legislature regarding the pilot program
13 created in section 1 of this act. With respect to each community
14 college pilot site, the report shall include the following:

15 (1) The number of long-term care workers trained prior to the
16 college's participation in the pilot program and duration or extent of
17 such training;

18 (2) The number of long-term care workers trained subsequent to the
19 college's participation in the pilot program and duration or extent of
20 such training;

21 (3) The identity of community and business partners providing
22 tangible commitments to each pilot site, together with a detailed
23 description of those tangible commitments; and

24 (4) The amount of the grant moneys received, dates of receipt, and
25 a detailed description, including costs, of the renovation, expansion,
26 and acquisitions associated with the grant moneys.

27 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 3.** If specific funding for the purposes of this
28 act, referencing this act by bill or chapter number, is not provided by
29 June 30, 2008, in the omnibus appropriations act or the omnibus capital
30 appropriations act, this act is null and void.

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
