- 6 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 28B.50 RCW 7 to read as follows:
- 8 (1) Subject to funding provided specifically for the purposes of
- this section, the state board for community and technical colleges, in 10 consultation with the exclusive bargaining representative of individual
- providers under RCW 74.39A.270, shall allocate capital grants on a 11

- 14 care workers required under chapter 74.39A RCW. Moneys must be used to
- renovate or expand existing community college facilities, or to acquire 15

- 7 (2) This section expires July 1, 2015.
- 8 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 28B.50 RCW 9 to read as follows:
- By December 1, 2014, the state board for community and technical colleges shall file a report with the capital budget and higher education committees of the legislature regarding the pilot program created in section 1 of this act. With respect to each community college pilot site, the report shall include the following:
 - (1) The number of long-term care workers trained prior to the college's participation in the pilot program and duration or extent of such training;
- 18 (2) The number of long-term care workers trained subsequent to the 19 college's participation in the pilot program and duration or extent of 20 such training;
 - (3) The identity of community and business partners providing tangible commitments to each pilot site, together with a detailed description of those tangible commitments; and
- 24 (4) The amount of the grant moneys received, dates of receipt, and 25 a detailed description, including costs, of the renovation, expansion, 26 and acquisitions associated with the grant moneys.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. If specific funding for the purposes of this act, referencing this act by bill or chapter number, is not provided by June 30, 2008, in the omnibus appropriations act or the omnibus capital appropriations act, this act is null and void.
