- AN ACT Relating to newborn screening; amending RCW 70.83.020;
- 2 adding new sections to chapter 70.83 RCW; and providing an expiration
- 3 date.

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- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 70.83.020 and 2010 c 94 s 18 are each amended to read 6 as follows:
 - screening tests of all newborn infants ((before they are discharged from the hospital)). Each hospital shall collect and submit a sample blood specimen for all newborns born in the hospital no more than forty-eight hours following birth. The department of health shall conduct agreening togts of samples for the detection of phonylkotonymia.

(1) It shall be the duty of the department of health to require

- 12 <u>conduct screening tests of samples</u> for the detection of phenylketonuria
- 13 and other heritable or metabolic disorders leading to intellectual
- disabilities or physical defects as defined by the state board of
- 15 health: PROVIDED, That no such tests shall be given to any newborn
- 16 infant whose parents or guardian object thereto on the grounds that
- 17 such tests conflict with their religious tenets and practices.
- 18 (2) The sample required in subsection (1) of this section must be

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- 1 received by the department within seventy-two hours of the collection
- of the sample.
- 3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 70.83 RCW 4 to read as follows:

5 In each instance in which the department of health notifies the infant's attending health care provider that the infant's screening 6 test indicates a suspicion of abnormality, which may include an 7 inadequate collection of a sample blood specimen, that requires further 8 9 diagnostic evaluation, the attending health care provider shall notify 10 the department of health of the date upon which the screening test 11 results were disclosed by the attending health care provider to the 12 parents or guardian of the infant.

- NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 70.83 RCW to read as follows:
- The department of health shall compile an annual report for public 15 16 distribution regarding the compliance rate of hospitals at meeting the 17 deadlines established under RCW 70.83.020 for newborn screenings. report must include information related to the performance of each 18 19 individual hospital. The annual report must also include information 20 about the extent to which health care providers are promptly informing 21 parents and guardians about infant screening tests that indicate a 22 suspicion of abnormality that requires further diagnostic evaluation. The report must be made available in a format that does not disclose 23 24 any identifying information related to any infant, parent, or guardian, 25 or health care provider. The report must be posted in an accessible 26 location on the department of health's web site.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. Sections 2 and 3 of this act expire January 1, 2020.

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
