- AN ACT Relating to increasing early learning access for children ages three and older; and amending RCW 43.216.512.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 43.216.512 and 2018 c 155 s 2 are each amended to 5 read as follows:
 - (1) The department shall adopt rules that allow the inclusion of children in the early childhood education and assistance program whose family income is above one hundred ten percent of the federal poverty level if the number of such children equals not more than twenty-five percent of total statewide enrollment.
- 11 (2) The department shall adopt rules that allow the inclusion, as
 12 space is available, of children who turn three years old at any time
 13 during the school year and whose family income is at or below one
 14 hundred ten percent of the federal poverty level and:
- 15 <u>(a) The child has received early intervention services in the</u> 16 <u>early support for infants and toddlers program; or</u>
- 17 <u>(b) The child has been a participant in the early head start or a</u>
 18 <u>successor federal program providing comprehensive services for</u>
 19 children from birth through two years of age.
- 20 <u>(3)</u> Children included in the early childhood education and 21 assistance program under <u>subsection</u> (1) of this section must be
