- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 70.62 6 RCW to read as follows:

- 10 after the effective date of this section:
- 11 (a) The price per night;
- 12 (b) The duration of the short-term rental period;
- 13 (c) The full name of the parties to the agreement, including the 14 full name of the guest and the person operating the transient
- 15 accommodation; and
- 16 (d) The notice language provided in subsection (2) of this 17 section.

 - (1) The term "transient accommodation" shall mean any facility such as a hotel, motel, condominium, resort, or any other facility or place offering three or more lodging units to travelers and transient guests.
 - (2) The term "person" shall mean any individual, firm, partnership, corporation, company, association or joint stock association, and the legal successor thereof.
 - (3) The term "secretary" shall mean the secretary of the Washington state department of health and any duly authorized representative thereof.

- (5) "Secretary" means the secretary of the Washington state department of health and any duly authorized representative thereof.
- (6) "Short-term agreement" means an agreement for the short-term rental of a lodging unit that (a) meets the requirements of section 1 of this act, and (b) is signed by the parties to the agreement, including the guest and the person operating the transient accommodation or the person's agent or designee.
