Assuming the transfer described above is lawful, how would the school district, the County Treasurer, and the County Assessor determine the amount of money received from state forest funds, when in Jefferson County (and in other counties on the Olympic Peninsula, including Clallam County) the Washington State Department of Natural Resources, in addition to managing its lands, is also retained to manage county forest lands and, thus, the sums described as "state forest funds" are not purely state forest funds and are not susceptible to division between these two categories with certainty?

4. In the future, when a school district brings a bond proposition before its qualified voters, must it, in the spirit of full disclosure, inform the voters in the ballot text that the revenues raised through the levy may be used for both debt service repayment and, if the revenue raised is in excess of what is needed for debt service repayment, other capital fund projects as is allowed by chapter 503?

The department of ecology (ecology) is proposing to issue a general permit to cover the control of aquatic noxious weeds in and around surface waters of the state. The draft permit and fact sheet are available for public comment. This permit, once issued, would replace and revoke the aquatic noxious weed control NPDES general permit that was issued on May 15, 2002, and expired on June 14, 2007. Ecology is proposing to issue the final permit soon after the comment period ends. The title of the revised permit is "aquatic noxious weed control national pollutant discharge elimination system and state waste discharge general permit."

The draft permit and fact sheet are available for review and public comment from October 3 to November 14, 2007. Ecology will host two informational workshops and public hearings on its proposed permit. Ecology encourages the

public to give written comments during the public comment period or oral comments at the public hearings.

Purpose of the General Permit: The proposed general permit covers the discharge of products used to control noxious weeds to waters of Washington state. Under the Washington State Water Pollution Control Act, the discharge of pollutants which may alter the biological or chemical characteristics of a water body requires a permit. The proposed permit addresses these legal requirements and regulates the discharge of pollutants to protect surface water quality in Washington state.

Ecology issues a general permit in place of a series of individual permits when the permitted activities are similar. Individual activities that receive coverage under the general permit must comply with the terms and conditions of the permit.

What Would be Covered by the Permit? This general permit covers aquatic noxious weed control activities that discharge chemicals into and around surface waters of the state of Washington.

Dear Mr. Haller:

Thank you for your letter dated July 27, 2007, concerning the above-referenced rule. It was received by the Governor's Office on July 30, 2007, two days after the statutory due date of July 28. Technically, under the Administrative Procedure Act, it is untimely and cannot be considered by the Governor.

Nonetheless, the Governor strongly supports the University of Washington Board of Regents' decision to protect the public and its employees from exposure to secondhand smoke. The health effects of secondhand smoke are well documented. In September 2006, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention reported that secondhand smoke exposure increases the risk of heart disease and lung cancer in non-smokers by 25-30 percent and is dangerous even after brief exposure. The Governor has long been committed to tobacco control and prevention and supports efforts by organizations to further protect the public from its harmful effects.

Please note that nothing in RCW 70.160 grants smokers the affirmative right to smoke in any particular location. This absence of an affirmative right combined with the University of Washington Regent's right as "owners" of the University to limit smoking more broadly than the minimum distances required by RCW 70.160, lead to one legal conclusion. The Regents have the legal right to regulate smoking on the campus, so long as they do not allow smoking in areas prohibited by RCW 70.160, and even if such regulations are more stringent than RCW 70.160.

Since your petition is untimely, the Governor lacks jurisdiction to either grant or deny it. However, given the clarity of the legal authority of the university, had your appeal been timely, the Governor would have likely denied it. Notwithstanding this, the Governor appreciates your expression of concern about the efficacy of WAC 478-136-035.
