The top margin of the first page shall be a minimum of three inches, the bottom margin shall be a minimum of one inch and the side margins shall be a minimum of one inch. All subsequent pages shall have a minimum of one inch margins. Papers filed shall not include any colored pages, highlighting or other colored markings. This rule applies to attachments unless the nature of the attachment makes compliance impractical.

(b) Exception for Trial or Hearing Exhibits. This rule is not mandatory for trial or hearing exhibits, but the use of trial or hearing exhibits that comply with this rule is encouraged if it does not impair legibility.

(c) Application of Rule. This rule shall apply to all proceedings in all courts of the State of Washington unless otherwise specifically indicated by court rule.

In addition, a qualified legal services provider shall be entitled to receive all court awarded attorney's fees for pro bono representation rendered by the lawyer.

Paragraph (e) provides that in-house lawyers, government lawyers, and others authorized to practice under paragraph (d) of this Rule may provide legal services for no fee through a qualified legal services provider, but it does not authorize any other form of law practice, whether for a fee or not, other than that authorized by Paragraph (d). For purposes of paragraph (e) of this Rule, the term "qualified legal services provider" is defined in Admission to Practice Rule 8 (e)(2) as "a not for profit legal services organization whose primary purpose is to provide legal services to low income clients."

**Air Quality Program Proposes to Amend the Natural Gas  
Fired Boiler General Order to Include Other Fuels**

Ecology's air quality program is proposing to amend the Natural Gas Fueled Boiler General Order. (General Order 06-AQG-001.) The revised general order incorporates opportunities for using fuels besides natural gas. These additional fuels are propane, liquefied petroleum gas and diesel fuel. The proposed order now contains additional requirements that would be in effect depending on the fuel chosen in such a way as to minimize the air pollution from the source. If a business wishes to install the equipment needed to operate a small water heater or steam generating boiler, an application can be made for coverage under the general order, or the business can choose to go through the older more site specific notice of construction order of approval. The choice is made by the applicant.

This order will be available to applicants in the counties that are regulated directly by ecology's air quality program. These counties are: San Juan, Okanogan, Chelan, Douglas, Ferry, Stevens, Pend Oreille, Kittitas, Walla Walla, Columbia, Garfield, Asotin, Grant, Lincoln, Adams, Whitman, Franklin, and Klickitat counties. Applicants in other areas are regulated by a local air agency and are subject to their notice of construction rules and procedures. This order is also available to those sources of statewide importance that are directly regulated by ecology.
