**Notice of Substantial Development Dollar Threshold Adjustment**

In accordance with RCW 90.58.030 (3)(e), the office of financial management (OFM) shall adjust the "substantial development" dollar threshold defined in the Shoreline Management Act every five years beginning July 1, 2007. The new dollar threshold shall be transmitted to the office of the code reviser for publication in the Washington State Register at least one month before the new threshold takes effect.

RCW 90.58.030 (3)(e), a part of the Shoreline Management Act, defines a substantial development to include any development with a fair market value exceeding five thousand dollars. The statute requires OFM to adjust this dollar threshold for inflation every five years. The adjustment is to be based on changes in the consumer price index for the urban areas of Seattle, Washington, during that five-year period. The new dollar threshold shall be published in the state register at least one month before the new dollar threshold takes effect.

In accordance with these requirements, OFM submits for publication the new dollar threshold of seven thousand forty-seven dollars (\$7,047). The new dollar threshold takes effect September 2, 2017.

The new threshold was calculated as follows: Over the five-year period from June 2012 to June 2017, the consumer price index for urban wage earners and clerical workers for the Seattle-Tacoma-Bremerton, Washington, area as reported by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, United States Department of Labor, increased by 9.8 percent. This percentage applied to

the prior threshold of six thousand four hundred sixteen dollars (\$6,416) results in an updated threshold of seven thousand forty-seven dollars (\$7,047).

Subject: The industrial fire precaution level system (IFPL) restrictions and tethered logging operations.

Description: RCW 76.04.325 authorizes the department of natural resources (DNR) to regulate/restrict industrial operations on forest lands. DNR implements this authority

under chapter 332-24 WAC. Part of those rules describe IFPL under WAC 332-24-301.

Recent advances in harvest techniques suggest that updated operational guidance about IFPL restrictions would be helpful and improve forest safety from potential human-caused fires. The interpretive statement referenced here explains that tethered logging system operations are basically new ways of using existing logging equipment, and that DNR's existing IFPL provisions in WAC 332-24-301 regarding that logging equipment (particularly those provisions applicable to power saws, cable yarding, and feller bunchers) apply to tethered logging systems.

This guidance will become effective immediately.

**RESCIND VISION SCREENING INTERPRETIVE STATEMENT,**  
**WSR 11-18-002**

Background and Summary: The Washington state board of health (board) has authority and responsibility under RCW 28A.210.020 to write rules for school-based vision screening. Prior to July 1, 2017, chapter 246-760 WAC, Auditory and visual standards—School districts, required schools to conduct central distance vision acuity and was silent with regard to screening for any other vision problems. On August 24, 2011 the board filed an interpretive statement, SBOH11-01, Permissibility of screening school children for vision acuity using procedures in addition to the Snellen eye chart test for distance acuity (WSR 11-18-002), with the office of the code reviser. The interpretive statement clarified that RCW 28A.210.020 does not prohibit schools from offering "voluntary screening for vision problems other than distance vision acuity."

On November 9, 2016, the board adopted amendments to the vision screening rule and filed the CR-103 on January 4, 2017, as WSR 17-03-009. This rule update included converting the interpretive statement into rule by adding rule language to WAC 246-760-020 to clarify that:

- (2) If resources are available, a school may:
  - (a) Expand vision screening to any other grade;
  - (b) Conduct other optional vision screenings at any grade using evidence-based screening tools and techniques; or
  - (c) Expand vision screening to other grades and conduct optional vision screenings as outlined in (a) and (b) of this subsection.

The new rule language went into effect on July 1, 2017. As a result the interpretive statement is no longer needed. The board adopted a motion to rescind interpretive statement SBOH11-01 on August 9, 2017.
